

May 27th: Fair and cold, North wind.
Paying Grassy Narrows and Wabuskang Band member all day.
Payments completed at 6.00 P.M. and returned to post.

May 28th: Fair and warm, light S.W. wind.
Paid a few more Band members who arrived during night.
Listened to complaints and grievances most of morning and held meeting with Band in afternoon. They request that the Department give assistance toward providing them with portable sawmill. They were given to understand that this might be possible after the war but not at present. The matter of American Tourists, hunters and fishermen, supplying the Indians employed as guides, with liquor was brought to my attention. I would suggest if possible that arrangements be made with the Ontario Department of Game and Fisheries to have printed on each licence issued to non-residents, a warning in this regard. They also wanted to know if it was the intention of the Indian Affairs or the Department of Game and Fisheries to deprive them of the right to hunt and fish for their own use off their reserves. The subject of children being sent to the Residential School at McIntosh was fully discussed. The reasons given for not cooperating fully were not very impressive. I agreed to meet the Chief and Councillors at McIntosh some time in September and investigate each complaint with the School authorities. The Band passed a resolution to have all outside Band members living in the vicinity of, or on, the Reserve, transferred to the Grassy Narrows Band. This did not include the Wabuskang Band members.



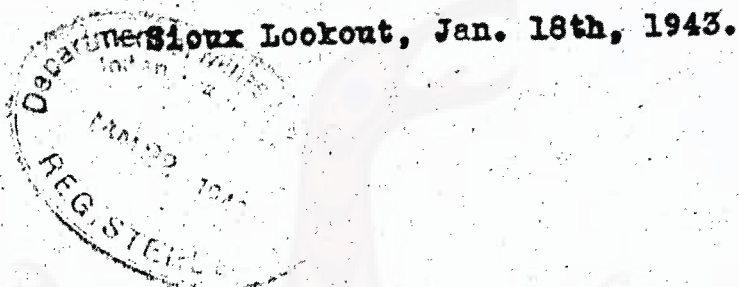

Last week a periodic visit was made to the McIntosh Indian Residential School by the undersigned. It was brought to my attention that about twelve children from Grassy Narrows I.R. had not returned to the School since last fall. Approximately half this number were new pupils who should have been enrolled in September. We gave notice in writing to the parents or guardians in November, informing them that the children must be sent to school immediately. Only two children have been returned to date as a result of this warning.

I would suggest that a member of the R.C.M.P. from Kenora be sent to Grassy Narrows with instructions to bring all delinquents out to McIntosh. Some of the children are out with their parents on the trap lines, consequently it would be impossible to contact all of them at once.

It is proposed that the parents and guardians be prosecuted under Section 10 for failing to have their children attend school after having been notified. This action would not be practical until Treaty time but even then it would serve as a good example.



Suzanna Ferguson is an illegitimate orphan, consequently there is nowhere for her to go when she leaves the school unless we are able to find employment for her as well as the others.

It is recommended that these girls be allowed to continue at the school for another year or until such time as arrangements can be made for their employment.

Dear Sir:

On January 23rd, 1945, the application for wardship of the step-children of the above-named soldier was heard. When the evidence re residence was taken, the mother volunteered the information that the children were Treaty Indians, although she had lost her treaty status through her marriage to Danielson. The case was remanded until January 31st, 1945, to have the Indian Department represented.

At the second hearing the Indian Department was represented by Mr. Ward Leroy, who states that by a ruling of the Indian Department these children are to remain wards until they are twenty-one years of age. The Magistrate stated that he found the children neglected, and if it were not for the fact that they were already wards of the Indian Department, he would have made them wards of the Children's Aid Society.

In discussing this matter afterwards with Mr. Leroy, he told us that he was thinking of sending the children down to the MacIntosh School. The little girl is crippled and he thought it might be arranged for her to attend the Shriner's Hospital in Winnipeg from the school.

We will be interested to know your decision on this case and shall be glad to give you any further information you may require.

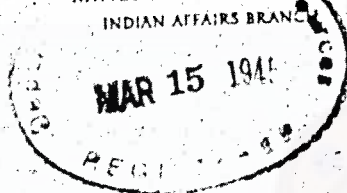



As their home, in the City here, was found unfit to live in they were brot with their Mother to magistrate's court, and we arranged to have them admitted to the McIntosh Indian residential school, where they would be cared for. One of the children, however, (Merle) is at present a patient in our Squaw Bay Indian Hospital on the Fort William Indian reserve. Applications for their admission to the McIntosh school have not been forwarded to Ottawa, due to the fact that their Mother refused to sign the application forms, but it is expected these will be forwarded you in a few days time.

With reference to Elizabeth, one of the children sent to McIntosh school, Dr. Gillie, our Indian doctor, considers that she should be given treatment for her hip at the Shriner's Hospital, at Winnipeg, Man., just as soon as she reaches a certain age. This matter is under his consideration at the present time and you will be advised later.

I trust that my action in this matter meets with the Department's approval.

I wish to acknowledge Mr. Phelan's letter of April 20th, File 130-7-10, with respect to McIntosh Indian Residential School pupils.

James Paishk and Alex King are still at the school. I discussed this matter with Rev. Father Perrault who informed me that these boys were sent in from Red Lake with the understanding that they were members of his church. Their parents, or guardians, in the case of the King boy, were away on their trap lines and it was impossible to get in touch with them. From your letter of January 31st I understood that I was authorized to make the most practical arrangements possible under the circumstances, and after reviewing all the information available, I decided that the logical solution would be to have the boys remain at McIntosh until June. I will interview the parents and guardians in June or July and discuss the matter fully with them at that time. It is nearly five years now since I have seen the Paishk family, consequently I am not very familiar with their latest religious belief. In the meantime it is recommended that the boys be allowed to remain at McIntosh as grant-earning pupils until the end of the present term. It is also recommended that all Missionaries, when recruiting pupils for the various schools, be requested to take every precaution in order not to have children of one faith being admitted to a school of different faith. This only causes a lot of unnecessary controversy, correspondence and ill will.

We are returning herewith the applications for admission of the two boys in question.



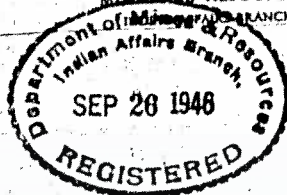

I wish to acknowledge Mr. Phelan's letter of September 20th, 1946, File 130-7-10 (W. T. 1) with respect to our recommendation for a grant to cover air transportation charges for pupils coming in to McIntosh Indian Residential School from the remote northern points.

During the summer months in the north I endeavoured to recruit certain children for both our Residential Schools, as instructed. Parents and guardians would promise on the spot to send or bring the children out early in September, but in many cases would change their minds. Some children have arrived at the Schools concerning whom no previous arrangements had been made. In tracing back we find they decided among themselves to send others instead of the ones we had previously arranged for. This might partly explain why we are not in a very good position to be certain in advance, just how many children will come out to School.

We have had a few come out from Fort Hope and Lansdowne to the line by canoe. This is a very hard trip of nearly 100 miles with many portages. At this season of the year the parents feel that they are neglecting their own livelihood during the period required to bring the children out. It should be remembered too that in the first place many of the parents are not anxious to send their children to Residential Schools and refuse to spend any time or energy in getting them out. Children from Ogoki are obliged to come out by plane due to the fact that the water route south is not navigable by canoe at this season.

In most cases, however, the children are brought out to school without any cost to the Department, either by white people interested in their well-being, or the parents paying the air fares themselves. It is just for children who should be at school and for whom no other means except air transportation is available or practical that the grant was applied for by Father Comeau and recommended by the undersigned.

A glance at the geographical situation of the Sioux Lookout Agency will show that most of the pupils for the Residential Schools must come from the North. There are not sufficient children living off the Reserves along the main line of the C. N. R. to provide the necessary pupilage.

I realize that the extra money required for air transportation would go far and be used to good advantage at any Residential School, but there is no object in having these Schools unless they are kept reasonably well filled.

Therefore in view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the grant of \$300.00 for the McIntosh School be provided and we will do our utmost to see that it is spent only on those pupils who have no other means of transportation and who otherwise would be denied the opportunity of attending School, which has always been our endeavour.
