Dear Sir; Re-Shingwauk Indian School Milk Supply

The local Medical Officer at Sioux St. Marie, has drawn to our attention, a situation that is causing some considerable embarrassment.

I believe that this Indian School is located within the city limits, and it is pointed out that a herd of cattle is maintained at the School, and that raw milk is used by all the children there.

You will understand that legislation prohibits the use of raw milk in any of our cities or towns and this is being observed by others in Sioux St. Marie, Naturally, it causes a good deal of discussion and embarrassment when a government institution permits the use of raw milk and other people are forbidden to use this.

I should be glad to have your comments in connection with this. It should not be difficult to have the milk for use at the School pasteurized to have the milk for use at the School pasteurized by one of the local dairies.
