Spanish Indian Residential School for Girls St. Joseph - Roman Catholic Spanish, Ontario,

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted school, covering a period from September 1st, 1936 to August 31st, 1937.

I commenced my examination on the morning of September loth and completed it on the 11th. I had completed my work at the Boys' school on the 9th.

Bank, Cash Book, Cheques and Vouchers,

The attached bank and cash adjustment statement was prepared and shows a bank balance of \$6,766.12 (verified) at August 31st, 1937 against which eight cheques totalling \$315.43 were outstanding leaving a net bank balance of \$6,450.69. Cash on hand being \$162.84 the actual balance at August 31st was therefore \$6,613.55 which agreed with the cash book balance.

The paid cheques and the paid vouchers were examined and checked to cash book. The postings in the cash book were correctly recorded with the exception of a few entries which were improperly allocated. These were corrected and brought to the attention of the book-keeper.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the Cash . Book and paid vouchers.

Receipts:

The total receipts for the year amounted to \$21,483.15. in which is included \$2,025.00 which is the value of food produced and consumed at the school. The Government grants for the year totalled \$18,163.21.

The proceeds from Farm and Garden cash sales only amounted to \$34.00.

The estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the school is shown as \$2,025.00, which was roughly estimated. A record of the produce supplied to the kitchen was kept but no value was placed on such food at the time of delivery.

L.W.McCutcheon, Esq., Chief Treasury Officer, Indian Affairs Branch, Department of Mines and Resources, Ottawa.

The records showed the following had been received at the kitchen;

14,104 quarts of milk, 492 dozens of eggs, 304 bags of potatoes, 77 fowls and chickens (estimated at 385 lbs.), 635 lbs. of beef, 98 lbs. of veal, 72 bags of turnips and 2 bushels of carrots.

In order to have a more completed record and also to determine a more accurate value of such food, I have suggested to the Principal that the local market value be shown in future.

The receipts from other sources are itemized in the statement. The sundry refunds include refunds and rebates received from various firms with which the school has dealings.

Expenditurest

The total salary charges amounted to \$4,700.38 of which \$3,664.86 was paid to lay members of the staff. The balance, namely \$1,035.52, was paid from school funds, in lieu of salary, for the following pur chases and services for the benefit of the members of the Order of Sisters. members of the Order of Sisters,-

This procedure was adopted in accordance with instructions received from the Department. Letter October 16th, 1935.

The total salary charge is slightly over 26% of the percapita grants received from the Department.

The cost of clothing for the year is shown as \$1,693.75 as compared with \$1,412.06 last year.

The charge of \$2,051.18 for "'phone, fuel, light and water" is divided as follows:-

Cost op Operation - Statement No. 3.

The cost of operation is based on an expenditure of \$20,055.16 which is considered actually applicable to the running of the school. There is a slight increase over the previous year.

The average cost per pupil per day is shown as .46 cents while the amount allowed by the per capita grants was .4167 cents. Included in the cost is the estimated value of food produced and consumed at the school which amounts to approximately .047 cents per pupil per day.

List of Staff - Statement No. 4.

The staff presently employed is listed on the attached statement, and the annual salaries being paid to the lay members of the staff is shown.

The members of the Order of Sisters do not draw regular salary but certain expenses, in lieu of salary, are paid from school funds.

The expenses in this connection are covered above under "Salary Expenditures".

Livestock and Crops.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 7 cows and 46 hense

The crop produced in 1936 consisted of 25 bushels of oats, 15 tons of hay, 141 bags of roots and 304 bags of potatoes.

General

The school appears to be very well conducted. The records are neatly kept and are complete.

A few suggestions which I offered in previous years have been followed and no difficulties are encountered.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy extended to me and the assistance which I was afforded by both Miss St. James and Miss Gilbert during my visit.

Re - Spanish Schools for Boys and Girls (R/C) and Audit.

You will observe from the two audit reports hereunder that in lieu of selaries drawn, the members of the Sisterhood and Brotherhood of the respective Orders have clothing made from the general supply of clothing and material all of which is charged to the clothing expense item of the pupils.

Donations and gifts are also made periodically to various institutions, these are in the form of cheques charged to the grant, and are apparently in lieu of salaries to the staff. From an accounting standpoint and for information of the Department such a procedure is misleading.

No accurate record is obtainable regarding the actual clothing cost of the pupils, and such clothing and donations etc. used in lieu of salaries should be recorded as salaries.

The same applies to dental and medical services for the staff, expenditures of which should be regarded as salaries and not charged to "miscellaneous expense" of the school.

The attached letter is drafted for your approval, and when sent to the Principals, Miss Z. St. James and Rev. P. Mery, it would be appreciated if a copy of your letter be supplied to this office for record purposes.

A report has been received recently in connection with an audit of your school records by Mr. E. H. Berthe of the Treusury Branch.

Dear Sir:

I submit herewith a report of an examination of the books and records at the above mentioned Residential School, covering a period of one year, from September 1st, 1935 to August 31st, 1936.

School for Boys.

I arrived at the school at 10.00 a.m. November 7th - Saturday - worked that day until 5.30 p.m. and completed my examination on November 9th.

Cash Book and Bank Reconciliation.

The cash book was examined in detail. The vouchers and paid cheques were examined and checked to cash book, all of which were found to correspond correctly.

This year a voucher was on hand in support of every item of expenditure, a matter which was lacking last year.

The vouchers are filed in order of payment and bears the same number of cheque by which the payment is made. This has proved very convenient for reference purposes.

Attached hereto as Statement No. 1, is cash and Bank Adjustment Statement, showing a Bank balance of \$3,996.49 and a cash balance on hand of \$133.42, making a total balance of \$4,129.91 at August 31st, 1936.

Receipts, and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

Receipts:

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the Cash book and the vouchers.

The total receipts for the year amounted to \$23,786.25 of which \$18,317.64 was received from the Department covering per capita Grants.

W. W. McCutcheon, Esq., Representative of the Treasury, Department of Indian Affairs, OTTAWA. Under

Under Farm and Garden receipts is shown the amount of \$3,605.31 which is the approximate value of the food produced and consumed at the school. In my opinion, this is fairly accurate as an actual record is kept of the produce supplied to the kitchen, and the bookkeeper is advised of the value by memorandum at the end of each month.

The proceeds from the Farm and Garden sold was \$327.65 which was derived from the cash sale of eggs and poultry.

The amount of \$692.92 is shown as received from the Girls' school during the year. This is for services performed by the boys' school, such as shoe repairs, electrical and carpenter work, and also the share of the operating cost of the lighting and water plant.

Refunds from the Department of the cost of transportation of children to their home amounted to \$371.81.

A refund of \$276.51 was also received from the Department for new shoe machinery purchased.

Gasoline tax refunded by the Provincial Government amounted to \$173.10 of which \$65.70 was paid to the Girls school.

Expenditures:

The expense under salaries amounted to \$5,167.58 of which \$1,167.58 was said to lay members of the staff. The balance, viz: \$4,000.00 was paid in lieu of salary into a special fund for the benefit of the religious members. I was informed by the Principal that this was in accordance with verbal arrangements with the Department. The total salary charge is slightly over 25% of the per capita grants and this is considered reasonable as compared with other schools of this size.

The clothing expenses shown as \$1,698.40 is a big reduction over the previous year when the cost was \$4,547.24. This is partly accounted for by a large quantity of goods being purchased last year for making clothes for the pupils and a large part of this stock was used only this year. Another element which had some result was that no clothing for the members of the Order was purchased from School funds this last year. In previous years, as there were no other funds available year. In previous years, as there were no other funds available for such purchases, the cost of such clothing was included in the School expense under the heading of clothing. Practically every article of wearing apparel and all the shoes are made at the school.

The cost of food purchased amounted to \$4,652.17 and the value of food produced and consumed is shown as \$3,605.31 for which there is a contra entry under receipts.

The miscellaneous charges amounted to \$1,342.09

I have detailed the more important charges under "Miscellaneous" Statement No. 2. - The laundry is done by the Girls' school
and the cost of such services, including mending, amounted to
\$983.60 for the year.

Cost

Cost of Operation - Statement No. 3.

The cost of operation is based on an expenditure of \$23,134.45 which is the expenditure considered actually applicable to the running of the school. This is slightly higher than last year with the exception of clothing which is considerably lower.

The average attendance for the year was 118

pupils.

The average cost per pupil per day is shown as .53.56 cents while the amount allowed by the per capita grant was .42.41 cents. Included in the cost is the value of food produced and consumed which amounts to approximately .08 cents per pupil per day.

List of Staff - Statement No. 4.

The staff presently employed is listed as per attached statement which shows the salaries paid to the lay members of the staff. The \$4,000.00 withdrawn in lieu of salary was on account of the members of the religious Order.

Livestock and Crops.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 7 horses, 21 milch cows, 1 bull, 11 heads of young cattle and 1032 poultry.

The crop produced in 1935 consisted of 95 tons of lary, 400 bushels of oats, 20 tons of corn, 227 bags of potatoes and a quantity of vegetables the quantity of which could not be estimated.

General:

The books and records are kept in an excellent condition. As far as I could ascertain, the church activities and its cost, also the private expenses in connection with the Order, are kept acparate from the school cost.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy extended to me during my visit at the school.

Dear Sir:

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above mentioned School, covering a period of one year from September 1st, 1935 to August 31st, 1936.

I commenced my examination on the morning of November 10th and completed it on the 11th. I had completed my work at the boys' school on the 9th.

Cash Book, Bank, Invoices and cheques.

The cash book was examined in detail and the invoices and paid cheques were also examined and checked to cash book, all of which were found to correspond correctly. There were no missing vouchers this year, as was the case on my first visit last year.

A bank adjustment statement was prepared, as per Statement No. 1, attached, showing a bank balance of \$4,977.11, and a cash balance on hand as \$208.43, making a total balance of \$5,185.54 at August 31st, 1936.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

Receipts:

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the cash book and vouchers.

The total receipts for the year amounted to \$21,639.49, of which \$17,840.12 was received from the Department covering per capita Grants.

The proceeds from Farm and Garden cash sales only amount to \$26.90, which was received from the Farm Manager. The estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the School is shown as \$2,175.00, which was only roughly estimated. A record of the produce supplied to the kitchen was kept but no value was placed on such food at the time of delivery.

The sum of \$1,202.32 was received from the Boys' School during the year. \$983.60 of this amount was for laundry and mending and the balance was on account of coal which was purchased by this school and part of the car was for the Boys' School.

Transportation refund amounted to \$44.78.

Interest on Savings amounted to \$29.50. Gasoline tax refunds from the Provincial Government amounted to \$65.70, which amount was received through the Boys' School. Sundry refunds which amounted to \$255.17 were mostly on account of goods which were returned and refunds obtained.

Expenditure:

The total salary charges amounted to \$3,593.79 of which \$2,782.85 was paid to lay members of the staff. The balance, viz: \$810.94 was paid from school funds, in lieu of salary, for the following purchases and services for the benefit of the members of the Order of Sisters.

This was in accordance with instructions received from the Department - Letter of October 16th, 1935.

The total salary charge is slightly over 20% of the per capita grants and this is considered most reasonable. The Principal is satisfied with this arrangement.

The expenses in connection with fuel, light, and water, are greater than the previous year by \$1,113.18. In former years the charges for light and water were not fully recorded. The plants for the supply of light and water are operated by the Boys! School and this year the Girls! School has been fully charged with its share of the cost of operation.

The charges under miscellaneous have been itemized as far as possible. Numerous small payments have been made from petty cash and when reimbursements were made many of the charges were shown under miscellaneous.

Cost of Operation - Statement No. 3.

The cost of operation is based on an expenditure of \$19,521.87, which is the expenditure considered actually applicable to the running of the school. This is slightly less than the previous year and this is partly due to the higher average attendance during the year under review. The average attendance for the year was 117.6 pupils.

The average cost per pupil per day is shown as .45.35 cents while the amount allowed by the per capita grants

was .4144 cents. Included in the cost is the value of food produced and consumed which amounts to approximately .05 cents per pupil per day.

List of Staff - Statement No. 4.

The staff presently employed is listed as per statement No. 4, attached, which shows the rate of salaries paid to the lay members of the staff.

The members of the Order of Sisters do not draw salary but certain expenses, in lieu of salary, are paid from the school funds.

Livestock and Crops.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 7 cows and 118 hens.

The crop produced in 1935 consisted of 7 tons of hay, 160 bushels of cats, 225 bags of potatoes and 66 bushels of roots.

General:

The books and records were found in very good order and neatly kept.

The few suggestions offered last year were well followed and a better record was available this year.

I was afforded every assistance by the Principal and the bookkeeper during the course of my visit at the school.

Spanish Indian Residential School for Girls St. Joseph - Roman Catholic Spanish, Ontario.

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted school, covering a period from September 1st, 1936 to August 31st, 1937.

I commenced my examination on the morning of September loth and completed it on the 11th. I had completed my work at the Boys' school on the 9th.

Bank, Cash Book, Cheques and Vouchers.

The attached bank and cash adjustment statement was prepared and shows a bank balance of \$6,766.12 (verified) at August 31st, 1937 against which eight cheques totalling \$315.43 were outstanding leaving a net bank balance of \$6,450.69. Cash were outstanding leaving a net bank balance at August 31st was thereon hand being \$162.84 the actual balance at August 31st was therefore \$6,613.53 which agreed with the cash book balance.

The paid cheques and the paid vouchers were examined and checked to cash book. The postings in the cash book were correctly recorded with the exception of a few entries which were improperly allocated. These were corrected and brought to the attention of the book-keeper.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the Cash of Book and paid vouchers.

Receipts:

The total receipts for the year amounted to \$21,483.15, in which is included \$2,025.06 which is the value of food produced and consumed at the school. The Government grants for the year totalled \$18,163.21.

The proceeds from Farm and Garden cash sales only amounted to \$34.00.

The estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the school is shown as \$2,025.00, which was roughly estimated. A record of the produce supplied to the kitchen was kept but no value was placed on such food at the time of delivery.

The records showed the following had been received at the kitchen:

14,104 quarts of milk, 492 dozens of eggs, 304 bags of potatoes, 77 fowls and chickens (estimated at 385 lbs.), 635 lbs. of beef, 98 lbs. of veal, 7\frac{1}{2} bags of turnips and 2 bushels of carrots.

In order to have a more completed record and also to determine a more accurate value of such food, I have suggested to the Principal that the local market value be shown in future.

The receipts from other sources are itemized in the statement. The sundry refunds include refunds and rebates received from various firms with which the school has dealings.

Expenditures:

The total salary charges amounted to \$4,700.38 of which \$3,664.86 was paid to lay members of the staff. The balance, namely \$1,035.52, was paid from school funds, in lieu of salary, for the following pur chases and services for the benefit of the members of the Order of Sisters,-

Cost op Operation - Statement No. 3.

The average cost per pupil per day is shown as .46 cents while the amount allowed by the per capita grants was .4167 cents. Included in the cost is the estimated value of food produced and consumed at the school which amounts to approximately .047 cents per pupil per day.

List of Staff - Statement No. 4.

The staff presently employed is listed on the attached statement, and the annual salaries being paid to the lay members of the staff is shown.

The members of the Order of Sisters do not draw regular salary but certain expenses, in lieu of salary, are paid from school funds.

The expenses in this connection are covered above under "Salary Expenditures".

Livestock and Crops.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 7 cows and 46 hens.

The crop produced in 1936 consisted of 25 bushels of oats, 15 tons of hay, 141 bags of roots and 304 bags of potatoes.

General

The school appears to be very well conducted. The records are neatly kept and are complete.

A few suggestions which I offered in previous years have been followed and no difficulties are encountered.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy extended to me and the assistance which I was afforded by both Miss St. James and Miss Gilbert during my visit.

The paid cheques and vouchers were examined and checked to Cash Book, all of which were found to correspond correctly.

The vouchers are filed in order of payment and the number of the paid chaque is indicated on each vouchers

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

Receipts:

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the Cash Book after the examination of the cheques and vouchers had taken place.

The total receipts for the twelve months under review amounted to \$24,711.52 in which is included the value of food produced and received in the kitchen. The sum of \$18,289.05 represents the per capita grants received from the Department.

The farm and garden each sales only amounted to \$50.85 which was derived from the sale of poultry and eggs.

The miscelleneous receipts are itemized under "Sundry Refunds".

The amount of \$764.59/is shown as received from the Girls' school during the year. This is for services rendered by the Boys' school, such as shoe repairs, electrical and carpenter work, and also the share of the operating cost of the lighting and water plant.

Refunds from the Department of the cost of transportation of pupils to their homes amounted to \$365.75.

The Department also refunded \$795.79 to cover the cost of new batteries, for the lighting plant, which were purchased during the period.

Gasoline tax refunds received from the Provincial Government amounted to \$89.70.

Expenditures:

The expense under salaries amounted to \$4,457.55 of which \$1,457.55 was paid to lay members of the staff. The sum of \$3,000.00 was withdrawn, in lieu of salary, and placed into a special fund for the benefit of the religious members. Last year the amount withdrawn for this purpose was \$4,000.00.

The clothing charges for the year amounted to \$3,733,57. Included in this item is the cost of laundry and clothing repairs which amounted to \$840.91 and was paid to the Girls' school.

The cost of food purchased amounted to \$5,741.29 and the value of food produced and consumed is shown as \$4,240.14 on account of which there is a contra entry under receipts.

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted Residential School covering a period from September 1st, 1937 to August 31st, 1938.

I commenced my examination on the morning of September 21st and completed it the following day.

Cash Book, Vouchers, Cheques, Etc.

The attached Bank and Cash Reconciliation - Statement No. 1 - was prepared and it shows a balance of \$3,110.44 at August 31st, 1938. This agreed with the cash book balance.

The paid cheques and vouchers were examined and checked to cash book. They were found to correspond correctly.

The vouchers are filed in order of payment and the number of the paid cheques is indicated on each voucher.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the cash book after the examination of the cheques and the vouchers had taken place.

The total receipts for the twelve months under review amounted to \$24,865.01 in which is included the value of food raised and consumed. The percapita grants received amounted to \$18,949.35. Farm and Garden cash sales amounted to \$2.75 only and covered the sale of hides.

The receipts from other sources totalled \$1,812.91. These are summarized on the attached statement.

The total diaburacments during the period amounted to \$25,967.04, in which is included the value of food raised and consumed.

In order ...

In order to save many explanations covering the expenditure under each heading, statement No. 2A was prepared and it shows in detail the most important items.

I understand it was agreed between the Department and the school to withdraw \$4,000.00 from School funds each year to cover salaries of the religious members of the school staff. Last year only \$1,500.00 was withdrawn for this purpose as it was felt that the school funds could not stand a larger amount being withdrawn.

Considerable repairs to the buildings were attended to during the year especially to the plumbing. It was estimated that the plumbing material cost \$1,019.28 and the labour - under extra labour - amounted to \$636.35.

New water tanks had to be purchased this year. The cost for such tanks is shown as \$421.80, but \$255.00 was refunded by the Girls' School to cover their share.

The expenditure on account of the Farm and Garden amounted to \$1,161.47 as compared with \$1,815.29 last year.

The miscellaneous charges amounted to \$1,452.44. I have detailed a few items on statement 2A, but owing to want of space on the statement, I shall detail here the item "Sundry",-

During the year the sum of \$250.39 was expended to purchase fishing nets. These nets were handed over to a local white fisherman who was supposed to supply the school with fish as required, thereby paying for the nets. During the year only some \$48.00 worth of fish was delivered. This arrangement was made by the former Principal, Father Mery, and it has not worked as satisfactorily as anticipated. I advised the Principal to get in touch with this fisherman and try to arrive at some understanding on the matter.

Cost of Operation - Statement No. 3.

of \$25,967.04 which is considered applicable to the operation of the school. There is very little difference in the cost over last year.

Included in the cost is the value of the food raised and consumed which amounts to approximately .09 cents per pupil per day.

The average attendance for the year was 124.7 punils.

The staff presently employed is listed as per attached statement. The annual salaries, if paid, would amount to \$5,620.00.

Livestock and Crops

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 7 horses, 19 cows, 1 bull, 15 young cattle and 550 poultry.

The crop produced in 1937, according to records, consisted of 51 tons of hay, 15 tons of green oats, 450 bushels of oats, 95 bushels of barley, 675 bags of potatoes, 157 bags of roots and 30 tons of silage corn. There was also a quantity of garden produce, the value of which was estimated at \$396.50.

A record was kept in the kitchen of the food produced and consumed and the value was estimated as follows:

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted school, covering a period of twelve months from September 1, 1937 to August 31, 1938.

I commenced my examination on the morning of September 23rd and completed it the following day.

Bank, Cash Book, Cheques, Vouchers.

The attached bank and cash adjustment statement - No. 1 - was prepared and shows a bank balance of \$7,441.06 at August 31st against which six cheques totalling \$179.02 were found to be outstanding leaving a net bank balance of \$7,261.14. Cash on hand amounted to \$75.00, therefore the actual balance was \$7,336.14 which agreed with the cash book balance.

The paid cheques and the paid vouchers were available and these were examined and checked to the cash book. The postings in the cash book appeared to be correctly recorded with the exception of an expense of \$255.00, covering renewal of water tanks, which was charged to water expense instead of buildings and repairs. The correction was brought to the attention of the book-keeper.

Roceipts and Expenditures - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the cash book after my examination of the paid cheques and vouchers.

The total receipts for the year are shown as \$22,772.00 in : hich is included the value of the food produced and consumed at the school. The Government per capita grants received during the period amounted to \$18,761.09.

During the previous year the total receipts were shown as \$21,483.15 of which \$18,163.21 was on account of per capita grants.

The proceeds from Farm and Garden cash sales amounted to \$24.39 and cover the sale of milk to the farmer.

The estimated value of food produced and consumed at the school is shown as \$2,429.10. A record was kept of the farm and garden produce supplied to the kitchen and the local market value was placed on such food at the time of delivery.

The records showed that the following had been received in the kitchen,

The receipts from other sources are itemized on the statement.

The total expenditure during the period is shown as \$22,049.39 in which is included the value of food produced and consumed at the school.

I have prepared statement No.2A, which shows in detail the various items of expenditure under each heading.

A change was made during September 1937 in the manner of paying salaries to the religious members of the staff. Formerly no salary was paid, but purchases and services rendered for the benefit of the members of the Order of Sisters were paid in lieu of salary.

During the early part of September 1937 the following were paid in lieu of salary.

The withdrawals during the period on account of salary amounted to \$2,300.00 of which \$300.00 covered the previous year's salary.

Salaries paid to lay members of the Staff totalled \$2,412.42.

The total salary charge for the year is 25.32% of the per capita grants received from the Department.

There was an increase over the previous year in the Buildings and Repairs expenses of \$1,583.81. A new ice house was built at a cost of \$1,151.00. Painting of the exterior wood work of the building cost \$600.00, and replacements of water tanks show an expenditure of \$255.00.

The total expenditure for the year is shown as \$1,994.23 higher than the previous year. If the value of the food produced and consumed were left out of each year the increase in the actual disbursement would be \$1,590.13.

The school, with a balance of \$7,336.14 at August 31, 1938, is in an excellent financial condition.

Cost

Cost of Operation - Statement No.3.

The cost of operation is based on expenditure of \$22,049.39 which is considered applicable to the running of the school.

There is a slight increase over last year except in the cost of clothing which is a little less.

The average cost per pupil for the year is shown as \$177.12 while the amount allowed by the per capita grants was \$150.70 per pupil. Included in the cost is the estimated value of food produced and consumed which amounts to \$19.51 per pupil.

List of Staff - Statement No.4.

The staff presently employed is listed on the attached statement, and the annual salaries to be paid are shown.

Livestock and Crops

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 6 cows and 121 poultry.

The crop produced in 1937 included 8 tons of hay, 90 bushels of oats, 302 bags of potatoes; and turnips and mangels valued at \$100.00. There was also a quantity of garden produce the value of which was estimated at \$240.20.

General

The records are neatly kept and are complete.

The school building presents a very neat appearance and the school appears to be well managed.

A new Principal, Miss Laferriere, has been appointed recently and she impressed me as being a capable person.

The bookkeeping is handled by Miss Gilbert and she is very efficient.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy extended to me and the assistance which was afforded by both Miss Laferriere and Miss Gilbert during the course of my visit to the school.

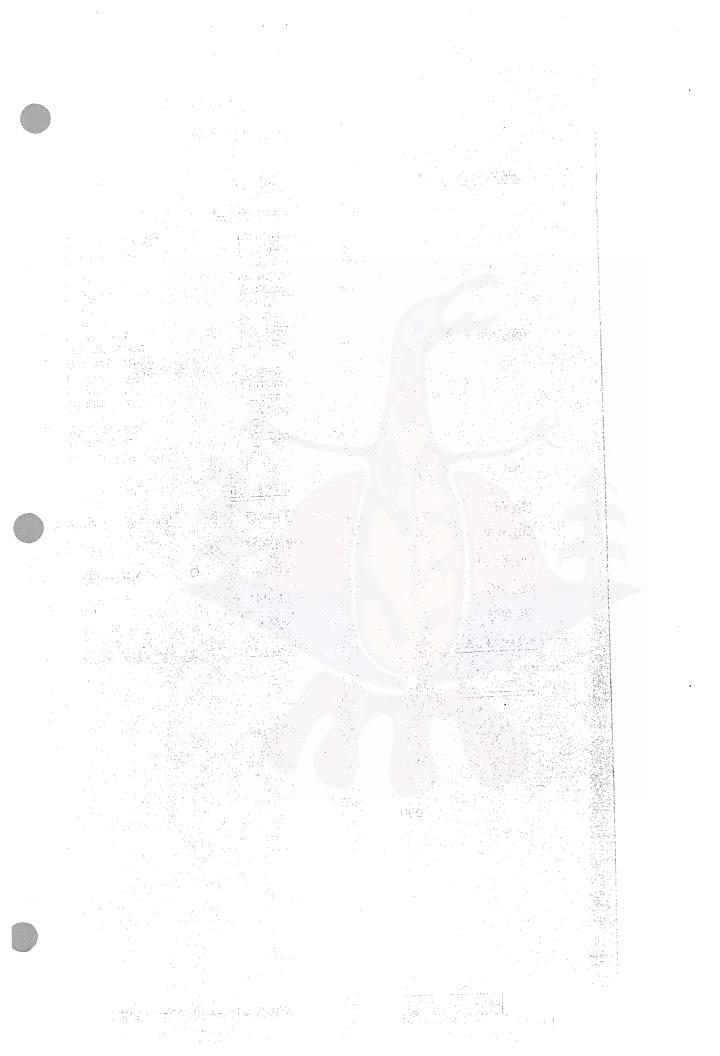

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted Besidential School, covering a period of twenty-three months, from September 1st, 1938 to July 31st, 1940. This school was not visited by an auditor during 1939.

I commenced my examination at 2.00 p.m. August 19th, and completed it at 5.00 r.m. August 21st.

The bookkeeper had onen away on vacation for a couple of weeks and he returned only on August 20th. The cash book, therefore, had not been written up for August.

Cash Book, Youchers, Changes, Fto.

According to bank mane books there was a balance of \$3,790.70 in the bank at July Blat. Unpresented cheques totalled \$31.52, leaving a net bank balance of \$3,758.55. The betty cash account was over-drawn \$6.01, therefore, the actual balance was \$3,754.57 which agreed with the cash book. - Jtakement No.1.

descints and Expenditures - Statement No.2.

The total receipts during the twenty-three months under review amounted to \$92,122.42, in which is included the amount of \$7,510.75, which represents the value of the food raised and consumed at the school. This amount is also shown as "contra" under

Included in the receipts under "Other Sources" is an item of \$2,071.57, which represents the amount paid by the Girls' School for Shoe recairs, the share of Gas and Oil used at the Light and Water the share of the services performed by the Boys' School, plant, and other services performed by the Boys' School, during the period. The other items are listed in Statement No.2 and are self-explanatory.

Expenditures:

The total disbursements during the same period amounted to \$51,477.99, in which is included as "contra" the value of the food raised and consumed at the school.

I have prepared Statement No.2A, in which is snown more in deteil the most important items of expenditure, thereby saving many explanations.

A Diesel Engine was purchased early this year at a cost of cl,;75.92 and half of the cost, viz: 4687.96, was haid by Girls' School. This is to replace a gasoline engine which was in use at the Light and sater plant, and which was about worn out. According to the Principal the jost of operating a Diesel engine will be much lower than that of a gasoline engine as a cheaper grade of fuel oil is used.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.3.

The cost of operation is based on an expenditure of \$51,477.99 less refunds and cash sales amounting in all to \$5,321.44. There is very little difference in the cost as compared with two years ago.

Included in the cost is the value of the food raised and consumed which amounts to approximately .09 cents per pupil per day.

The overage attendance during the period was 126.361 pupils.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 7 horses, 20 cows, 1 bull, 8 heifers, 7 calves and 250 hens.

The farm consists of approximately 140 acres of arable land. Apart from this there is considerable pasture and wood land.

The crop produced in 1939, according to school records, consisted of 100 tons of hay, 300 bushels of oats, 40 bushels of barley, 149 bags of potatoes, 8 tons of ensilage corn and 147 bags of roots. There was also a quantity of gerden produce, the value of which was estimated at \$536.20.

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted school, covering a period from September 1st, 1938 to August / 16th, 1940.

I commenced my examination at 2.00 p.m. August 16th and completed it at noon August 19th, 1940.

This school had not been visited last

year.

Bank, Cash Book, Cheques, Youchers, Etc.

The attached Bank and Cash Reconciliation Statement No.1 - was prepared and shows a bank balance of \$6,493.21 at August 16th, against which fourteen chaques totalling \$585.44 were found to be outstanding, leaving a net bank balance of \$5,907.77. Cash on hand amounted to \$75.00, therefore the octual balance was \$5,982.77, which exceed with the cash book.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the pash book. Most of the vouchers were available and these were checked by test. With very few exceptions the postings appeared to be properly allocated under the various headings of expenditures in the cash book.

receipts and Excenditures - Statement No.2

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the synoptic cash took after the necessary adjustments had been taken into account.

proceipts:

The total receipts during the period under review are shown as \$16,302.96 in which is included the value of the food produced on the farm and garden and consumed at the school. The Government per capita Grants received during the wear, covering two full years, amounted to \$35,442.75.

The proceeds from Farm and Garden cash sales amounted to \$36.57 only and cover the sale of milk to the farmer.

The estimated value of food produced on the farm and garden and consumed at the school is shown as \$4,917.26. A record was kept of the produce supplied to the kitchen and the local market value was placed on such food at the time of delivery.

The receipts from other sources are itemized on the statement and are self-explanatory. During the period the school sold groceries and other supplies to the farmer and collections for these articles were made from monthly salaries.

`Expenditures:

The total expenditures during the same period amounted to \$17,356.33 in which is included as "contra" the value of food raised on the farm and gorden and consumed at the school.

I have prepared Statement No.2A, which shows more in detail the most important items of expenditures under each heading.

Under the meading "Phone, Fuel, Light and Water" is an item of 7057.96 which is the half share paid by this school for a Dienel Engine purchased for use in the Light and Water plant. The other half was paid by the Boys School.

Considerable receirs and replacements were made for which expenditure are shown under "Buildings and Repairs". A new high pressure boiler was purchased and installed for use in the laundry at a cost of \$1.255.94. Alterations and repairs to the plumbing dost \$1,166.41 for waterial and \$701.16 for wages of the plumbers. All the windows were equipped with metal strippings at a cost of \$689.00. Other respirs were of a minor nature.

The expenditure under "House Equipment" were about normal with the exception of \$601.05 for Insurance on Eulidings and pontents.

I have itemized the items under "Tiscellaneous" as much as I could.

The

The School, with a balance of \$5,982.77 at August 16th, 1940, is in an excellent financial condition.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.3

The cost of operation is based on the amount of \$44,187.87, which represents the net expenditure for twenty-three months ending July 31st, 1940. In order to arrive at this amount, I have deducted from the actual expenditure of \$47,856.33, shown on Statement No.2, the disbursements of \$525.44, made during August, 1940, also the total receipts of \$3,142.92, received during the period under review.

There is a very slight increase in the cost of operation over the cost shown two years ago.

The average cost per pupil per year is shown as \$184.29 whilst the amount allowed by the per capita grants was \$153.65 per pupil. Included in the cost is the estimated value of the food raised and consumed which amounts to \$20.51 per pupil per year.

Staff

The staff presently employed is listed on Statement No.4 and the annual salaries payable are shown as \$5,120.00. The average yearly grants received during the past two years amounted to \$19,221.39, therefore the salaries are 26.6% of the grants.

Livestock and Crop:

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 5 cows and 100 pullets.

The land available for farming consists of 25 acres only.

The crop produced is 1939 included 9 tons of hay, 36 bushels of oats, 31 tons of turnips and mangels and 65 bags of potatoes. There was also a quantity of garden produce the value of which was estimated at \$530.30.

General:

The books and records were found to be neatly and accurately kept.

The school buildings appeared to be in a good state of repair and they present a neat appearance.

The bookkeeping is handled by the same person, a Miss-Gilbert, and she appears to handle her work very efficiently.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy and the assistance extended to me by both the Misses Inferriers and Gilbert during the course of my visit.

Bank, Cash book, Cheques, Vouchers, Etc.

The bank accounts are kept with the Royal Bank of Canada, Blind River, some thirty-five miles from Spanish. Two bank accounts are maintained, one in savings and the other is current account on which the cheques are drawn. According to the bank pass books, which had been written up to August 16th, the combined bank balances amounted to \$9,832.00. The outstanding cheques totalled \$2,304.03, leaving a net bank balance of \$7,527.97. There was \$75.00 cash on hand, therefore, the actual balance was \$7,602.97, which agreed with the cash book. — Statement No.1.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the cash book. The vouchers were available and these were checked by test. The postings in the cash book appeared to be properly allocated under the various headings of expenditure.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No. 2

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the synoptic cash book and covers a period of twelve months, from August 17th, 1940 to August 16th, 1941.

Receipts

The total receipts during the period are shown as \$23,578.68, in which is included the value of the food raised and consumed at the School. The amount viz: \$2,650.04, is also shown as "contra" under expenditures. The per capita grants received during the period totalled \$19,133.97 of which \$800.00 covered adjustments for a previous period.

The proceeds from the farm and garden cash sales amounted to \$25.69 only and cover the sale of milk to the farmer.

Under "Other Sources" is shown the receipt of \$1,308.59 from the Boys' School. This covers laundry service, repairs of clothing, and also some coal supplied to the other school.

The school supplied groceries and other articles to the farmer and collections of \$105.21 were made from monthly salaries.

The other receipts are itemized on the statement and are self-explanatory.

Expenditures:

The total expenditures during the same period amounted to \$21,958.48 in which is included as "contra" the value of food raised and consumed at the School.

I have prepared Statement No.3 which shows more in detail the most important items of expenditures under each heading.

The disbursements under "Buildings and Repairs" were quite high, but the Principal explained to me that an implement shed had to be rebuilt, and considerable repairs had to be done to the basement floors and to the stairs leading to the basement. A certain amount of painting was also undertaken.

The disbursements under the other headings are about normal.

This School appears to be operated very economically and with a balance of \$7,502.97 at August 16th, 1941, is in a very sound financial condition.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

The cost of operation for the year is based on a net cost of \$20,163.81. The cost per pupil per year at \$162.81 is \$1.48 less than reported in the previous report.

Included in the cost is the estimated value of food raised and consumed which amounts to \$21.40.

The

The average attendance during the year was 123.549 pupils.

Staff

The staff employed at August 20th is listed on Statement No.5. This list was supplied by the Principal. Provision is made for three teachers, two vacant at time of visit. The Principal expected to have the positions filled for the beginning of the school year.

Livestock and Crop.

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 6 milch cows, 3 young cattle for beef, 4 pigs, and 90 pullets.

The land available for farming consists of 25 acres only and most of the feed has to be bought. There was no grain nor hay harvested this year. The potato crop had not been harvested. Last year the potato crop brought 151 bags. There was also four tons of mangels and turnips used for feed. The garden provides considerable food each year.

General:

The books and records were found to be very well kept and up to date.

A Miss Gilbert is the bookkeeper and she appears to keep the records accurately.

The foregoing, to the best of my knowledge and belief and from the vouchers and records which have been placed at my disposal, is a true and complete statement of the condition of the accounts at the time of my audit. The Principal advised that there were no outstanding accounts.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy and the assistance extended to me by both the Principal and the bookkeeper during the course of my visit.

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted Residential School, covering a period of twelve months, from August 1st, 1940 to July 31st, 1941.

I commenced my examination on the morning of August 18th, and completed it at noon the next day.

Cash Book, Vouchers, Cheques, Etc.

The bank accounts are kept with the Royal Bank of Canada, Blind River, some thirty-five miles from Spanish. Two bank accounts are maintained, one in savings and the other is a current account on which the cheques are drawn. According to the bank pass books, which were written up to July 31st, the combined balance at that date was \$3,440.69, against which two cheques amounting to \$106.05 were found to be outstanding, leaving a net bank balance of \$3,334.61. The petty cash account was overdrawn \$5.65, therefore, the actual balance was \$3,325.93, which agreed with the cash book - Statement No.1.

The paid cheques were available, and these were examined and checked to the cash book. The vouchers were on hand and they were examined by test and the allocations were checked to the cash book.

Receipts and Expenditures - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the synoptic cash book after I had completed my examination of the cheques and the vouchers.

Receipts

Dear Sir:

The total receipts during the twelve months under review amounted to \$24,865.56, in which is included the amount of \$4,492.56, representing the value of the food raised and consumed at the school. This amount is shown also as "contra" under expenditures. The per capita grants received during the period amounted to \$19,362.03, grants received during the period amounted to \$19,362.03, in which is included \$500.00 adjustment of grants for a in which is included \$500.00 was received in previous period. A cheque for \$1,600.00 was received in December, 1940, and according to the slip inclosed with the cheque, it represented supernumary grant for 10 pupils. One half of the amount, \$500.00, was given to the Girls' School.

The farm and garden eash sales, amounting to \$106.45, included the following:-

Included in the receipts under "Other Sources" is an item of \$452.20, which represents an amount received from the Girls' School for shoe repairs, the share of gas and oil used at the light and water plant, and other services performed by the Boys' School during the period. The other items are listed on Statement No.2 and are self-explanatory.

Expenditure:

The total expenditure during the same period amounted to \$25,294.50, in which is included as "contra" the value of the food raised and consumed at the School.

I have prepared statement No.3 on which are detailed the most important items of expenditure.

The Jesuit Order has installed a grist mill and a bakery on their property to supply the bread to the School. The cost of purchase and operation of the mill and bakery was financed by the Order. Both have been in operation since early in June this year. According to the Principal the bread will be sold to the school at a fair price, not higher than the contract price from an outside bakery. The average cost of bread at this school in the past has been in the vicinity of \$120.00 per month, and it will be interesting to note the cost next year. Although the bread had been supplied from this source since early in June, no accounts had been rendered to date of visit.

There were no items which could be classed as extraordinary expenditures during the year.

Insurance premiums amounting to \$756.05 were paid from School funds as in past years. The buildings are the property of the Jesuit Order, and in the event of a fire, undoubtedly the Jesuit Order would collect the insurance. This matter was discussed with the Principal. He explained to me that they were under agreement with the Department to withdraw \$4,000.00 per year from School funds in lieu of salary for the members of the Order employed at the School. This has never been paid in full. During the last twelve months only \$3,300.00 was withdrawn on account of salary, and the Principal felt that even by including the cost of insurance premiums the members of the Order were still underpaid. However, it would be better if the salaries were paid in full and the insurance premiums paid from funds other than those of the School. The Principal agreed that the manner of financing in this respect was somewhat involved and he promised to consider this point in future.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

The cost of operation is based on an expenditure of 125,294.50 for the year, less refunds and oash males

amounting ...

amounting to \$1,010.97, or a net expenditure of \$24,283.53.

The cost per pupil during the last year was \$3.73 higher than the period covered in the previous report. The cost of clothing and food was slightly less.

Included in the cost is the value of the food raised which amounts to \$35.50 per pupil per year.

The average attendance during the year was 125.458 pupils and the quota is 125.

Staff - Statement No.5

The principal supplied me with a list of the Staff employed at August 1Sth, 1941. According to the principal, Mr. Chaput, the carpenter, is only temporarily employed.

Livestock and Crops

According to the principal, the livestock consists of 7 horses, 15 milch cows, 34 head of young cattle, 1 bull, 9 pigs, and 200 hens.

According to school records, the crop produced in 1940 consisted of 200 bushels of oats, 225 bushels of mixed grain, oats and barley, 73 tons of hay, 345 bags of potatoes, 8 tons of ensilage corn, 67 bushels of mangels and beets, 30 bushels of turnips and carrots. There was also a quantity of garden produce, the value of which was estimated at \$229.40.

A record was kept in the kitchen of the food produced and consumed during the twelve months under review and the value was shown as follows:

The school property, owned by the Jesuits of Upper Canada, consists of approximately 1000 acres of which approximately 140 acres are considered arable. The remainder consists mostly of wood land. The school wood is out from the school property.

A farm was rented this year for which \$50.00 was paid in rental. A fair crop of grain was expected to be harvested from this farm shortly after my visit.

The books and records appeared to be in good order and recorded up to date.

I commenced my examination on August 17th and completed it the next day.

The cash book was made up to July 31st, only. The Principal and the bookkeeper were away, but Father Hawkins, the assistant Principal was on hand and he was able to produce the books and records I needed.

Cash Book, Vouchers, Cheques, Etc.

The bank accounts are kept with the Royal Bank of Canada, Blind River, some thirty-five miles from Spanish. Two bank accounts are maintained in Savings, and the other two bank accounts on which cheques are drawn. According is a current account on which were written up to July 31st, to the bank pass books, which were written up to July 31st, the combined balance at that date was \$2,053.52, against the combined balance at that date was \$2,053.52, against which there were six outstanding cheques totalling \$161.17, leaving a net bank balance of \$1,592.35. Cash on hand amounted to a net bank balance of \$1,592.35. Cash on balance was \$2,058.63, \$166.28, therefore, the actual school balance was \$2,058.63, which agreed with the oash book balance. - Statement No.1.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the cash book entries.

The vouchers were available and these were examined by test and the allocations in the cash book were verified.

Receipts and Disbursements - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the cash book after I had completed my examination of the cheques and vouchers.

Receipts:

The total receipts during the twelve months under review amounted to \$26,180.80, in which is included as "contra" the amount of \$5,894.37 representing the estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the school.

The ...

The per capita grants received during the year amounted to \$15,476.89. In addition a special grant of \$1,153.00 for 1941 was received.

The farm and garden cash sales brought \$120.66 only and are detailed on Statement No.2.

The receipts from other sources as shown on the statement are self-explanatory.

Disbursements:

The total disbursements during the same period amounted to \$27,448.10, in which is included as "Contra" the value of the food raised and consumed at the school.

I have prepared statement No.3, on which are detailed the most important items of expenditure.

There were no items which could be classed as extraordinary expenditures during the year.

As reported last year, the Jesuit Order operate a grist mill and a bakery on their property to supply the bread to the School. These have been in operation since June, 1941. The cost of bread during the year amounted to \$1,613.77, in which is included an outstanding account of \$190.99 at the time of my last visit. The net cost of bread for the year, therefore, would be \$1,422.75, or an average monthly cost of \$118.56. I estimated the monthly cost last year at \$120.00. According to the Assistant Principal the arrangement is working very well and a better quality of bread is being supplied than formerly from outside bakeries.

myford

There were no insurance premiums paid from School funds during the year. During the previous year the sum of \$756.08 was paid. I questioned the item last year and I suggested that, as the buildings were the property of the Jesuit Order, it would seem reasonable to expect the order to pay the insurance premiums. The Principal agreed last year that the insurance premiums should be paid by the Jesuit Order and he promised to consider the matter in future. There was a change of Principal during the last summer and the new incumbent was absent when I visited the achool.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

The cost of operation is based on a net cost of \$26,791.68 for the twelve month period, as compared with \$24,283.53 for the previous year.

The average attendance was 127 pupils and on that basis the cost per pupil per year would be \$210.36, as compared with \$193.56 for the previous year or an increase of \$18.50 per pupil.

The cost of clothing per pupil is shown at \$6.01 which is a very low cost. It was explained that there was a surplus stock of yard goods on hand at the beginning of the period and that most of the clothing is tailored by the school staff and pupils.

The ...

The cost of food per pupil at \$93.50 is very high but it includes the food raised at the school and this was estimated at \$5,894.37 or \$46.41 per pupil. This appears rather high, but apparently a complete record was kept in the kitchen and a record was kept of the following commodities produced;

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above-noted school, covering a period from August 17, 1941 to August 18, 1942.

I commenced my examination on August 19th and completed it the next day.

Bank, Cash Book, Cheques, Vouchers, etc.

The bank accounts are kept with the Royal Bank of Canada, Blind River, some thirty-five miles from the school. Two bank accounts are maintained, one in savings and the other in a current account on which the cheques are drawn. According to the bank pass books, which were written up to August 14th, the combined bank balances amounted to \$8,399.40. The outstanding cheques totalled \$1,426.96, leaving a net bank balance of \$6,972.44. Cash on hand amounted to \$422.60, therefore, the actual school balance.was \$7,395.04, which agreed with the cash book - Statement No.1.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the cash book. The vouchers supporting the disbursements were examined by test. The postings in the cash book appeared to be properly allocated under the various headings of expenditures.

Receipts and Disbursements - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the Synoptic Cash Book and covers a period of one year from August 17, 1941, to August 18, 1942.

Receipts.

The total receipts during the period are shown as \$24,603.52, in which is included the value of the food raised and consumed at the school. The amount, viz.: \$3,360.62 is shown also as "Contra" under disbursements. The per capita grants received during the period totalled \$18,419.11. In addition a special grant of \$1,153.00 for 1941 was received.

The cash sales from Farm and Garden brought in \$98.35 only.

A record was kept of the produce from the Barm and Garden supplied to the kitchen, and these commodities are

The receipts under "Other Sources" include an item of \$1,131.36 received from the Boys' School in payment of laundry services, repairs of clothing, and also for some coal supplied to the school.

The other receipts are itemized on the statement and are self-explanatory.

Disbursements:

The total disbursements during the same period amounted to \$24,811.45, in which is included as "Contra" the value of the food produced and consumed at the school.

I have prepared Statement No.3 which shows more in detail the most important items of disbursements under each heading.

A new boiler was installed as replacement at a cost of \$1,400.00.

The roof and the eaves had to be repaired at a cost of 3350.90.

The other items appear about normal.

From all appearances, this school is operated very aconomically and with a balance of \$7,395.04 at August 18th, 1942, is in a very sound financial condition.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

The cost of operation for the year is based on a net cost of \$23,140.66. The average attendance for the year was 126.407 pupils and on that basis the cost per pupil per year would be \$183.06, or an increase of \$20.25 per pupil over the previous year.

The cost of clothing was reduced from \$13.37 per pupil per year to \$11.90.

The cost of food per pupil per year is shown as \$76.23 us compared with \$68.05 for the previous year. Included in the cost is the estimated value of the food produced and consumed and this worked out at \$26.58 per pupil.

Staff - Statement No.5.

The staff employed at August 19th is listed on Statement No.5. The information was supplied by the Principal and the annual

salaries are shown as \$5,840.00. The sum of \$5,889.40 was actually expended for salaries during the year under review. Provision is made for two teachers not yet engaged at the time of visit. The Principal expected to have the positions filled by September 1st.

Livestock and Crop

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 2 horses, 6 milch cows, 3 young cattle, 150 hens, 4 hogs and 19 goats, including 6 kids.

There are only about 25 acres of land available for farming and most of the feed has to be bought.

The 1941 crop included 30 bushels of oats, 52 bushels of mangles and 4½ tons of turnips, 337 bags of potatoes and a good crop of vegetables valued at \$496.43.

General

The books and records appeared to be recorded up to date and in excellent condition.

The foregoing report, to the best of my knowledge and belief and from the vouchers and records which were placed at my disposal, is a true and complete statement of the condition of the accounts at the time of my audit. As far as I could ascertain there were no outstanding accounts at August 19th, 1942.

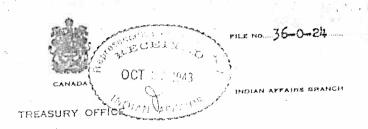

I commenced my examination during the afternoon of September 14 and completed it the next day.

Bank and Cash Reconciliation - Statement No.1

According to the bank pass books the bank balance at August 31, 1943 was \$3,027.16. There were six outstanding cheques totalling \$362.63, leaving a net bank balance of \$2,664.53. By adding \$400.00 cash on hand the actual school balance was \$3,064.53 at August 31, 1943 - Statement No.1.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the cash book.

examined by test. Several errors were detected in the allocation of the charges in the synoptic. These were brought to the attention of the Principal and the adjustments were taken into account when preparing the attached financial statements.

Receipts and Disbursements - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the synoptic covering the period under review.

Receipts:

The total receipts during the period amounted to \$24,716.15, in which is included, as "contra" the value of the food produced and consumed at the school.

The per capita grants received during the period amounted to \$18,692.80. In addition a special grant of \$1,153.00 for 1942 was received.

The oash sales from farm and garden brought \$39.05 only.

The school records show the following commodities having been produced and received in the kitchen:

The receipts under "Other Sources" include an item of \$949.22 received from the Boys' School in payment for laundry services and repairs of clothing.

The school was re-imbursed by the Department for repairs and pupils fares.

The Boys' School sold Deloo plant parts for \$224.70 and one-half of the sale price was handed over to the Girls' School.

Sundry supplies amounting to \$73.91 were sold to lay members of the staff.

Disbursements:

The total disbursements during the same period amounted to \$29,048.66, in which is included the amount of \$3,213.29 as "contra" the value of the food raised and consumed at the school.

I have prepared Statement No.3 which shows more in detail the most important items of expenditure under each heading.

The school purchased for each from accumulated school funds approximately 100 acres of land adjoining the school property. The purchase price was \$3,800.00, and an additional sum of \$30.49 was expended for fees in connection with the searching of title and registrations. The land is registered in the name of St. Joseph Indian Residential School. The Principal informed me that neither the Department nor the Principal of the Boys' School were consulted prior to the deal being made. There is a fairly good house, which was repaired recently by the school, and a stable on the property. The house is occupied by one of the farm hands. Approximately 35 acres is developed arable land and the remaining portion consists mostly of rough rocky land on which there is considerable timber. The Principal explained that, as the original school property consisted of only 25 acres, a very small percentage of the feed needed for the livestock could be produced. With the additional land she feels they will be able to raise much more feed and to maintain a larger herd of cattle.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

The statement shows comparative operating cost for the last two years.

As the purchase price of the farm is of a capital nature, I did not include that expenditure in the operating cost.

It will be noted that there is very little difference in the cost in the last two years. The cost per pupil per year shows an increase of \$2.16. There is a slight reduction in the cost of clothing. Food cost shows an increase of \$3.04 per pupil.

Staff - Statement No.5:

The staff as listed on the statement was provided me by the Principal. The annual salaries of the staff presently employed amount to \$6,300.00. The actual disbursement on account of salaries during the year amounted to \$6,280.65.

Livestock and Crop:

According to the Principal the livestock consists of 2 horses; 7 miloh cows; 4 heifers; 2 hogs; 160 poultry; and 7 goats, including 3 kids.

The crop in 1942 included 75 bushels of oats, 300 bags of potatoes, 4 tons of turnips and 6 bushels of mangles. There was also a good crop of other vegetables valued at \$392.69. No hay was produced. The 1943 crop of grain had not been threshed. The potato crop this year was a complete failure due to the very wet season.

General:

The books and records were recorded up to date and in very good condition.

As far as I could ascertain the accounts payable at August 31, 1943, totalled \$1,707.46 of which \$1,106.89 was paid early in September. An account amounting to \$600.57 for coal remained unpaid.

The foregoing report, to the best of my knowledge and belief and from the vouchers and records which were placed at my disposal, is a true and complete statement of the condition of the accounts at the time of my audit.

I submit herewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above noted School, covering a period of thirteen months from August 1, 1942 to August 31, 1943.

I commenced my examination on the morning of September 13th and completed it the next day.

Bank & Cash Reconciliation - Statement No.1.

According to the bank pass books, which were written up to August 31st, 1943, the bank balance at that date was \$1,989.59. There were no unpresented cheques, but the cash on hand amounted to \$425.66. The actual school balance, therefore, was \$2,415.25, which agreed with the cash book.

I also prepared a bank and cash reconciliation as at July 31, 1943, to tie in with statement No.2, which covers a twelve-month period ending July 31, 1943.

Cash Book, Cheques, Vouchers, Etc.

The paid cheques were available and these were examined and checked to the synoptic cash book.

The paid vouchers were examined by test and the allocations in the synoptic were checked. Several efforts in the allocation of charges were detected and they were brought to the attention of the Frincipal and the bookkeeper. A number of charges for repairs of equipment, farm implements, and motor car had been allocated under "Building and Repairs" in the synoptic. I explained to the Principal that the last mentioned column was intended to record repairs to buildings and permanent fixtures of buildings and that other minor repairs should be recorded under appropriate headings.

Receipts and Disbursements - Statement No.2.

This statement was prepared from an analysis of the synoptic cash book after the adjustments in the allocations had been made.

Receipts ...

Receipts:

The total receipts during the twelve months covered, amounted to \$28,408.97, in which is included as "contra" the amount of \$6,290.03, representing the estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the school.

The per capita grants received during the year amounted to \$18,937.64. In addition a special grant of \$1,155.00 for 1942 was received.

The farm and garden each cales brought \$355.25 and are detailed in the statement.

The receipts from other sources as detailed in the statement are self-explanatory.

Disbursements:

The total disbursements during the year amounted to \$26,766.24, including the contra amount of \$6,290.03.

I have prepared statement No.3, on which are detailed the most important items of expenditure.

The cost of clothing shows an increase of \$329.00. The Principal believes that the cost will be reduced considerably in another year as he is in receipt of discarded military clothing which can be used to make clothes for the boys.

The cost of food shows an increase of \$440.00 over last year. This is understandable as the prices on most food commodities have risen since last year.

The fuel cost shows a sharp reduction as there was no expenditure on this account during the year, as compared with \$976.49 for previous year. Considerable fuel was cut from school property and there were outstanding accounts of \$425.00 for fuel at August 31st.

The buildings and repairs cost shows an increase of \$420.00 over the previous year. Considerable interior painting was done by this staff and pupils. The paint cost \$69.97. Builders supplies, including lumber, cost \$425.15. The Department reimbursed the school an amount of \$449.54 for buildings and repairs, including \$111.07 for a goat house.

The cost of farm and garden shows a decrease of \$1,600.00 over the previous year. The following reductions were noted:

The cost of transport, freight and express shows an increase of \$535.87, which is made up as follows:

The cost of extra labour shows an increase of \$327.81.

Gost of Operation - Statement No.4

This statement shows a comparative cost in the last two years. It will be noted that there was a slight decrease in the last year in the general cost per pupil.

The cost of food is high, but it includes the estimated value of the food produced and consumed at the school. The school records show the following commodities having been produced and received in the kitchen:

Staff - Statement No.5.

The Principal provided me with the list of the staff as listed on the statement. The annual salaries being paid at present would amount to \$6,976.00 per annum. The salaries paid during the year amounted to \$6,552.74. Considerable difficulty was experienced during the year to have the service of a chef. A chef was engaged recently and the salary had to be increased.

Livestock and Grop:

According to the Principal, the livestock consists of 7 horses; 63 head of cattle, including 14 miloh cows, 46 steers and heifers and 3 bulls; 18 hogs; 600 poultry; and 22 goats, including 4 kids.

The school records showed the following crop for 1942:

1100 bushels of oats 115 tons of hay 450 bags of potatoes

The 1943 grain had not been threshed and a poor crop was expected due to the wet season. The hay crop

was fair but most of it was spoiled by the weather. The potatoe crop was affected by blight and only 270 bags were harvested.

General:

The books and records were found in good order and posted to August 31, 1943.

As far as I could ascertain accounts payable on hand at August 31, totalled \$2,255.15.

The foregoing report, to the best of my knowledge and belief and from the vouchers and records which were placed at my disposal, is a true and complete statement of the condition of the accounts at the time of my audit.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy and the assistance extended to me by both the Principal and the bookkesper during the course of my audit.

Disbursements:

The total dispursements during the year amounted to \$27,036.47 including the contra amount of \$2,746.22, being the value of the rood raised and consumed at the school.

I have prepared statement No.3 which shows more in detail the most important items of expenditure under each heading of the synoptic.

Salaries show an increase of 1970.00. This is partly due to extra help being used in connection with the farm which was bought last year.

The cost of clothing shows a reduction of \$277.02 from last year. Jonsiderable clothing is being made over from discarded military clothing.

The cost of food was reduced by 342.01.

Fuel, light and water show the larger increase in the cost, that of 13,769.01. The cost of ruel at 13,605.63 ahows an increase of 12,921.97. The Principal explained that at the beginning of last winter there was very little tuel on hand and that now there is nearly enough fuel on hand to tide them ever the coming winter. 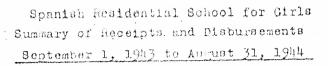

I submit nerewith a report of an audit of the books and records at the above-noted School covering a period of twelve months from Seytember 1, 1945, to August 51, 1944.

I commenced my examination during the afternoon of September 5th, and completed it the next day.

Sank and Cash Reconciliation - Statement No.1.

According to the bank pags books, which were written up to August 31, 1944, the bank balance at that date was 3995.93 with no unpresented cheques. Cash on hand amounted to \$337.07, therefore the actual school balance was \$1,533.00 which agreed with the cash book balance.

Ongh Book, Cheques, Vouchers, stc.

The paid cheques were examined and checked to the Synoptic cash book entries.

The vouchers supporting the dissursements were examined by test and the allocations in the synoptic were enesked. A few errors in the allocation of the charges were detected and they were brought to the attention of the Principal and the bookkeeper. The adjustments were taken into account when proparing the attached financial statements.

I have prepared Statement No.3 which shows more in detail the most important items of expenditures.

The cost of clothing shows a substantial increase over-

last

last year when the coat was very low.

The food cost shows an increase of slightly ever \$2,000.00, of which almost \$1,200.00 is in the value of food raised and consumed.

The cost of fuel shows a considerable deduction. The Principal explained that the cutting of fuel wood for the coming winter was done by the school staff at very little cost but it still had to be hauled which will entail some expenses.

The cost of house equipment and expense shows an increase of a little over \$800.00.

The cost of farm and garden shows an increase of \$635.38.

There was a reduction of \$488.57 in the cost of transportation, freight and express.

The costs under the other headings are about normal.

Cost of Operation - Statement No.4.

This statement shows a comparative cost for the last two years. The cost per pupil per year for the last year shows an increase of \$11.66.

The cost of clothing per pupil per year at \$6.44 is low. Most of the shoes are made at the school and some clothes are made from discarded clothing.

The cost of food per pupil per year shows an increase of \$11.03 over the preceding year.

Staff - Statement No.5.

The Principal provided me with the list of staff as shown on the statement.

The cost of salaries for the next year will be a little higher than the last year as an additional lay teacher had to be engaged for the current year. Also a new chef had to be procured at a higher salary than paid to the former chef.

Livestock and Crops.

According to the Principal the livestock consists of 6 horses, 19 milch cows, 10 heifers, 16 steers, 8 calves, 2 bulls, 13 pigs; 29 goats, including 13 kids; and 600 poultry.

The crop raised last year included 90 tons of bay; 600 bushels of oats; 450 bags of potatoes; and garden produce valued at \$608.00.

It was expected that 3700 one-half gallon jars of fruit and vegetables would be canned this year. 1700 jars were finished at time of visit.

General:

The books and records were found to be posted up to August 31st, 1945, and in good order.

As far as I could ascertain the accounts are paid promptly and there were no accounts payable on hand at the close of August.

The foregoing report, to the best of my knowledge and belief and from the books and records which were placed at my disposal, is a true and complete statement of the condition of the accounts at the time of my audit.

I wish to acknowledge the courtesy and the assistance extended to me by the Principal and his staff during the course of my audit.
