Dear Sir:-

I have corresponded with Mr Winger Indian Agent at Hagersville in connection with the discharge of Pupil No. 107 Norman Spencer whose father is a member of the Hagersville Band of Indians. Mr Indian Agnet Winger informs me the father is ready and willing to have his son return to him if the Department will pay his fare. This boy with others was sent here by the Department. In the case of the others sent in the same way the Department has in each case guaranteed the return fare I hope you will give permission for this boy. He is marked on our list as being 15 years of age and should this Summer be advanced to the age of 16 but in reality his father says he will be 18 years of age next February. This boy does not show any aptitude for learning in the class room and I think would do better under the guiding hand of his father.

Will you therefore please authorize me to send him home to his father. He has gone over the same work in the class room two or three years and does not apply himself and is keeping some other worthy child from the chance.




Reverend Sir,-

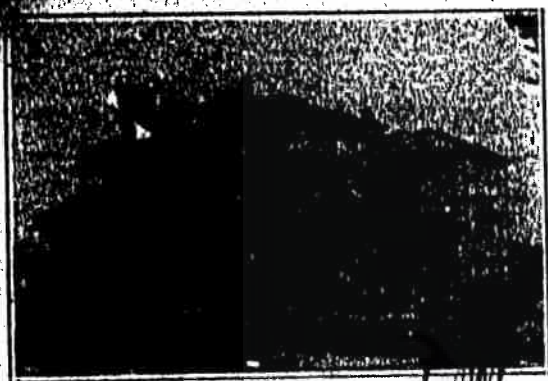

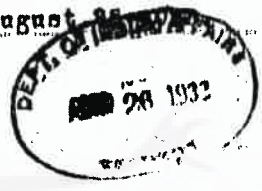

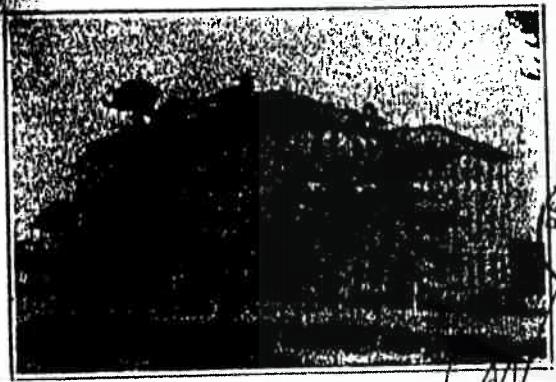

With reference to your T-5846 of the 31st ultimo, I beg to say that the Principal of the Chapleau Indian Residential School advises the Department that he can provide accommodation for Grace Misnabie and Norman Sabasatim. The usual application forms and certificates of health should be forwarded for the Department's file. Provided these children are pronounced medically fit, you may make the necessary arrangements to send them to Chapleau.

It is not considered necessary to have any one accompany them as they can be put in charge of the train officials and you can notify the Principal by telegram of the date of their arrival in Chapleau. He will meet them at the station and take them to the school.

Payment of the transportation costs of these children will be made on receipt of a properly certified account, in triplicate. No unnecessary expense should be incurred.

Sir:

I have to report that Moses Missabic past Chief of the Henvey Inlet Band, at Lower French has made application for his daughter Grace, who is seven years of age to be accepted at the Chapleau Indian Residential School. He has a boy who has been attending the Chapleau School since he was seven years of age. Moses Missabic is a Protestant and the School at Lower French is Catholic. He is very desirous that his little girl should be under the care of the St. John's Indian Residential School at Chapleau, because his wife is dead. I would recommend that this child be admitted to the School.

I have also had a request from Mrs. David Sahanation of the Gibson band, who is working in Toronto, and separated from her husband, that her boy who is living with his father on the Reserve be admitted to the Chapleau School. She states that her son is not being properly cared for, and she would like him to be sent to the School, along with his brother and sister. They are at present in the school. The possibilities are that this boy will grow up wild as he has no proper place to live and his father is quite often away from the Reserve, and leaves him to roam around. He generally goes to stay with his Aunt, Mrs. White, who gets nothing for his keep and is not desirous of keeping him.


Sir,-

You should, also, state what it would cost to send them home. It is understood, of course, that the Department will only consider payment of transportation costs from Chapleau to a railway point near their homes. We will not consider paying any costs after the pupils leave the railway line.

On receipt of your reply, the Department will be in a position to decide if these girls should be discharged this year.

This looks like the best solution for the child's best interests as the mother is not too good a character morally, and the child is just at the formative period of life, and ought to be reared into better surroundings. I know of no other institution, because of her parentage, which would be willing to look after her.

I expect to be at Chapleau on the 2nd Prox, and could arrange matters then, as the mother, I believe is residing there at the present time.

I know this is irregular, I should ask for the discharge first but I feel sure you will agree it is good to take advantage when I get the chance to place these girls and I cannot wait until I can get permission or miss the opportunity.



I do not think the other boys would pay for sending to the High School but Charlie Moore No.160 and Leslie Williams No.188 have no homes to go to and would be the better for being allowed to remain here longer. They will never make a mark in education but will do well in the outdoor work of the school on the farm and their characters would be the better able to withstand the temptations of surroundings on the Reserve if permitted to remain and be built up.

GIRLS:

NO.0103. Eileen Rathburn This girl has attended High School now for two terms. She did well at the Examination last Spring. I regret to say she has not done so well this year and I would recommend she be given her discharge and allowed to return to her married Sister's home in Burlington Ontario, who has offered her a home. As she was sent here by the Department, I presume they will pay her fare home.

NO.0120. Ruby Laforce. This girl is a big strong girl physically but has little ability as a student. She has asked me to try to get her a position as Domestic this summer if I can. She is not a member of the Band though she came from Bala. I would like permission to keep her on until I can, within a reasonable time get her placed. Her home surroundings would be very unhelpful if sent back to the Reserve this summer.

NO.0122. Jane Blacksmith, This girl has the makings of a fine type of woman. I think she ought to be given a chance to remain here longer and see what she can do in the classroom until she can be placed as a Domestic rather than be sent home to her father who has married again and the home is not fit for her to return to, with any chance to make use of her training here.

You ask my opinion of the other Pupils who were sent to the High School. I would say with a few exceptions they did not warrant the extra cost to send them. Some had ability but would not apply themselves. Others did not have the ability to meet the standard and became discouraged. One, Darcy Black, a lame boy, made very good use of his chance. He got his Junior Matriculation and took a course at Business College with Shaw of Toronto in Book Keeping and accounting and passed with Honours. He is I believe now a Time Keeper at one of the Fire Ranger Districts.

Miss Emily Donald passed and took up Normal Training as a Teacher. She taught three years in a day school and is this Fall trying to return to Normal to make her Teacher Certificate Permanent. She is applying to Normal School at North Bay this Fall.

Miss Ella Green, went to High School and then on to Train as a Nurse in Toronto. She has graduated and taken her R.N., and is employed at her Training home Hospital for as long as she desires to remain there.

Lorne Rathburn had ability but proved too lazy to carry on, He is now I believe an Orderly in a Hospital in Ottawa. I do not think it pays to send Pupils to High School unless they show special aptitude for it and I will be honest in not recommending any others if you allow me that privilege.

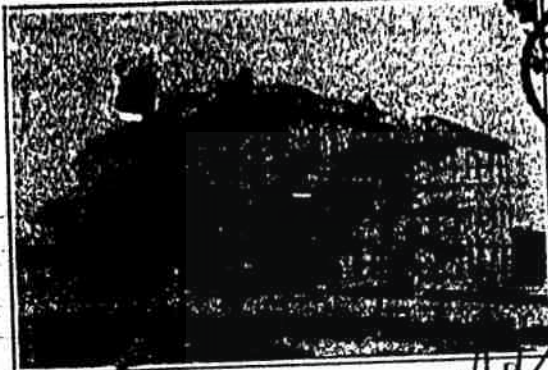

It seems to have eradicated all trace of the Tubercular trouble. He is ambitious to make use of his education and I think it would be a kindness to let him go on so he can be fitted to take a situation whereby he could earn a living for himself. If he were sent home now he would not have enough to fortify him against hardwork for which he is not physically fit. His home surroundings would be such that he would lose all good of his education.

No. 132. Calvin Moganosh. This boy is ambitious and will try his High School Entrance examination. If he secures the 70 per cent required to allow him to go on I think he would be well worth sending. If he fails he could be discharged.

Circular letter of the 15th instant outlined part of Section 10 (1) of the Indian Act. In future, the Department desires that, when children reach the age of 16 years and you consider they should be retained in the school for a further period, you should write the Department, through the office of your local Indian Agent, giving your reasons for keeping them and asking the Department's permission.

Great care should be exercised in choosing those who are given the advantages of high school education. The qualification of obtaining 70% on the Entrance examination is reasonably high, but, at the same time, I feel you will agree there is a better chance of obtaining children who will take advantage of the opportunity offered to them when we insist upon this standard. If children going to high school are not successful at the end of the year's examinations and are not promoted to a higher form, the Department is not prepared to consider granting them further assistance. You should, of course, write the Department before August 15th, giving the names and full particulars regarding any pupils of the Chapleau Residential School, who, you consider, should attend high school during the academic year 1934-35.

I am, as you state, fully aware her name should not have appeared in the column as a resident pupil in the school it was by oversight. I am writing to Winnipeg to tell them of the error so they will understand the deduction in the grant allowed.



Sir;

I beg leave to report that there are several children pupils of the Chapleau Indian School who have not returned to the school, and it appears that there is a regular organized effort to flaunt the requests that the children be returned, and I have been told that they were not sending them back, and as these families are getting relief I have advized them that their small allowance of relief would be out off but they still insist that they will not send the children back.

There are three families who are persisting in holding the children at home giving various reasons why the should not be sent back and I would suggest authority be given to send a truant officer or Policeman after them as it is having a very bad effect with the other children at the school.

Then there is another case that of a girl about 15 years of age who was given a return ticket to go and visit her Aunt in Toronto and now she will not return the girl and as I am informed that living with this woman is no fit place for this girl I would also reccomend that a truant Officer be sent to bring her back to the school, and unless firm action is taken in all these cases there will be a great deal of trouble in the future.

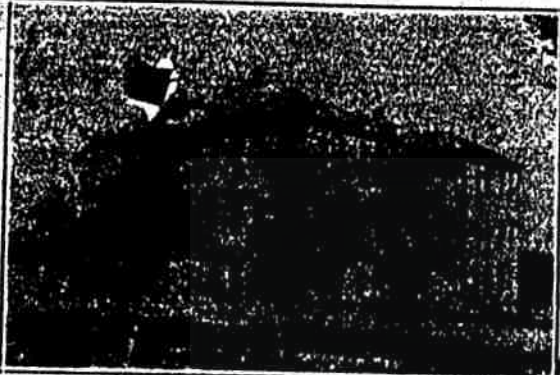

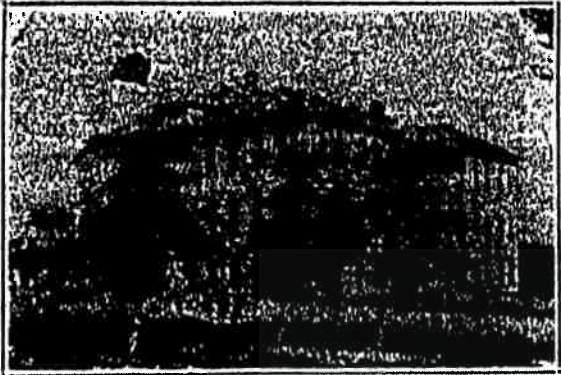

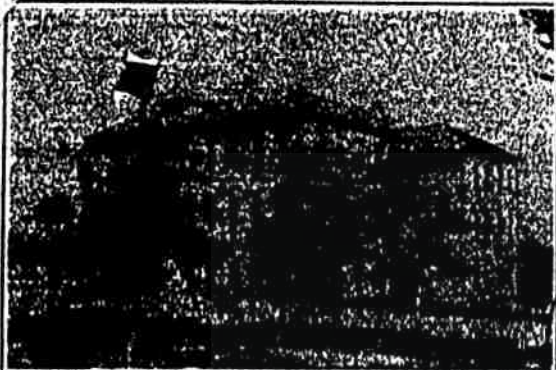

DEAR Sir:-

For the first time in my six years here I have had to call upon the Police to act as Truant officer and bring back some children who have overstayed their Summer Vacation and the parents refused to send them back.

I have taken up the matter with the Chief of Police in the town of Chapleau and he has acted within his jurisdiction. The question arises as to what shall be done in the case of children who are not in the Municipality and to be safe he has asked me to write to you and see if you will in accordance with the Indian Act appoint him as Truant Officer so as to enable him to go to the homes of the said children and compel them to return to school.

All the children who have not returned are under the school age of 16 years and therefore ought to be returned. The parents refuse in the case of two children at Missanabic Ontario about 50 miles west of this town on the Railway.

I would take this matter up through the Indian Agent but he is away on leave of absence at the present. He told me he would write for authority to have them brought back. I have waited two weeks and no word had come so, as I expect to be away from the school for a month on vacation, I thought it best to write you direct and ask you, if it meets with your approval, to appoint the Chief of Police here as Truant Officer to enable him to do what he is quite ready to do if granted such authority.

Will you be good enough to write him direct to the following address: P. Dery Chief of Police Chapleau Ontario.

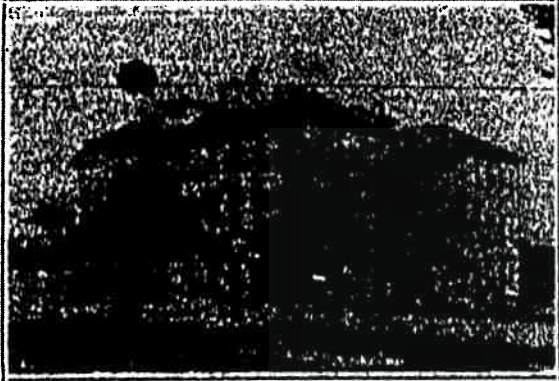

I hereby gratefully acknowledge receipt of your permission to pay the railway fare of Charlie Heil to Bala and will send the duly signed receipt for same.

In the same letter No. 65-I-10 Dated September 7th you ask after quoting a Telegram from James Gideon of Missinabic, if there is any reason the children should not be returned to the school? In reply would say there is absolutely no reason for not doing so. They are some of these I wrote to you in a previous letter in which I made request that you would appoint the Chief Of Police Truant Officer so he could compel these children to be sent back to school. They have ever stayed their leave for holidays and the parents, as shown in the telegram, have refused to send them back. The chief of Police of Chapleau made a trip up there for children. All of these whom he went to get came back quietly except this man's two children a boy and a girl he defied the Chief and said he was out of his territory and that he would not send them but would get in touch with you.

He makes the ridiculous statement that the children were inflicted with Head Lice when they went home. Every one here knows the reverse is the truth, they went home clean and each time they come back after holidays they had to be cleaned up. He says in a letter to me they went home dirty and for that reason he would not let them come back. You can appoint any person you wish to investigate I suggest you write the Indian Agent for a character sketch of this man who has given a lot of trouble in the past to the Agent.

It is my opinion an example should be made of this case and compel the return of these children and avoid more trouble of this sort in the future.

Will you be good enough to give the necessary authority to the Chief and so convince these people they must obey the law.

This woman while working in Toronto, Ontario got into trouble and refuses to tell the name of the man responsible.

She is very anxious to get out and secure work which it is impossible for her to do as long as she has to care for the child herself.

Replying to yours of October 4th, 65-1-10 re the admission of Bernice Kate King, to the Chapleau Indian Residential School, I have to state that Rev. Canon Vale has been a guest at my home for the last two or three days, and I was patiently waiting to receive this letter so that I would be able to send Bernice King to the Chapleau Indian Residential School along with Virginia Pawis.

Rev. Canon Vale left here on the Thursday morning train for Chapleau, with Virginia Pawis. Jack Stevens who met with an accident and has his hand practically blown away, and who has been in hospital up until a few days ago was also supposed to go to the school. I endeavoured to have him released from the Doctor's care in order to go to Chapleau with Virginia Pawis. I explained to Dr. Mason that they had a good hospital up there and had a trained nurse resident at the school, but he refused to allow the boy to go and said he would not be able to go for about a month. He is at present at home at Shawanaga Reserve, but has to attend the doctor for dressings. I presume that by the end of this month, he will be clear of the care of Dr. Mason and I will send him to Chapleau Residential School as arranged, and at that time will send Bernice King along with him, as he seems to be a bright little lad and would be able to look after her.

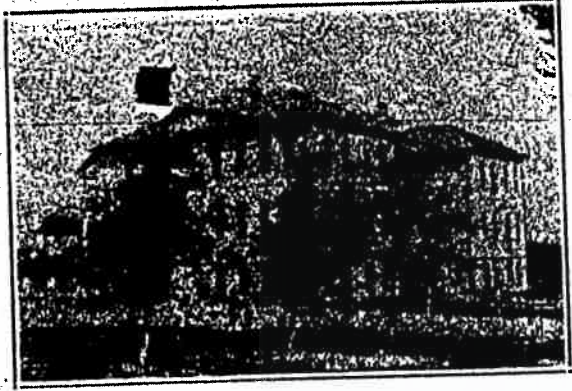

Bringing children from Moose Factory to Chapleau is apt to be rather costly, and, while I recognize that the school at Moose Factory is filled to capacity, at the same time our Appropriation will not permit us to provide travelling expenses for taking children to a residential school situated at a long distance from their homes.

Regarding the Gideon children, Mr. Agent Godfrey was instructed in official letter of the 15th ultimo to arrange with the officer in charge of the R.C.M.P. Detachment at Sudbury to return these children to your school. You might make enquiries from Mr. Agent Godfrey with a view to ascertaining what action he is taking in the matter.

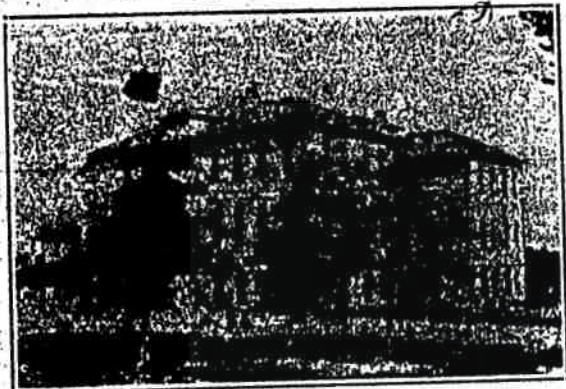

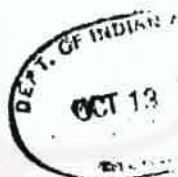

I have to report that I arranged for the transportation of William Jack Stevens, who is all right now and who Dr. Mason says is all right to send to the Chapleau School. I wired Rev. Canon Vale when he would arrived.

I had arranged for Bernice Kate King, daughter of Bertha King, to be sent to the Chapleau School along with the Stevens boy, but Bertha King did not turn up at the station this morning at 3:05. Elijah Tabobingdong, Bertha King's brother in law has been to this office this morning explaining why the child was not sent. It appears they have been looking after the child and have objections to Bertha King making arrangements for the child to go to Chapleau. They state they want her to go to the Shingwauk Home. As the child is a minor and not of the age to go to school, and the Department has been very good in arranging for this child to go to the Chapleau school so that Bertha King can go out to work, I stated to Elijah Tabobingdong that the possibilities were that the Department would not allow her to go to the Shingwauk Home.

The reason for Elijah Tabobingdong wishing the child to go to the Shingwauk Home is because his sister Mrs. Galna King had two children at the Chapleau School, and one died at the school, and the other died shortly after coming home from the school. They are prejudiced against the Chapleau School.

A letter has come through from the Mrs Charles Gidcen of Franz Ontario. Parent of Robert Gidcen, a pupil in our school No.153. In this letter she claims her son is 16 years of age and wants him to come home. According to our Records he is not that full age. She claims his birthday is December of this year and it will be his 16th. That does not correspond with our record. These people have a way of trying to place the age to suit their own purpose. In this letter she says the Indian Agent promised her the boy would be allowed to go home. I spoke to him about it and he emphatically said he had done nothing of the sort.

I told the woman I would try to secure the discharge for this boy next summer but I felt sure you would not let him go at Christmas time as she had not sent him back to school at the right time this Fall and the Department had to send for him. I shall be very grateful if you will uphold my stand in this case.

In her letter to her son she spoke of trying to get a Mr Selkirk of Franz to write to you and say the boy was needed at home to help the father. That is not true to the facts. It is merely an effort on her part to get her own way and have the boy home. The boy is quite happy here and needs the extra schooling.



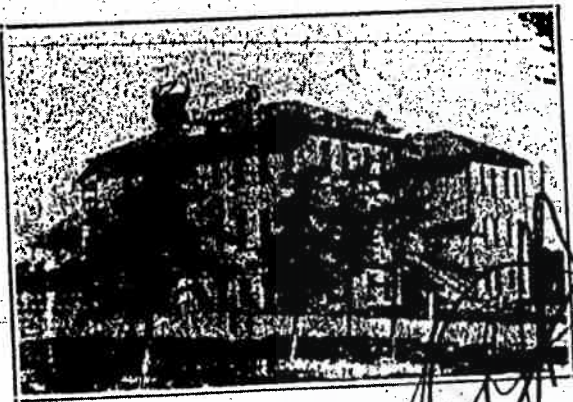

I have been asked by Wilson Assance Band No 111 to ask the Department of Indian Affairs if they would consider sending his three boys to a Residential School the following are names and ages of boys, Soloman Assance age 13 years, Samuel Assance 11 years, Lazarus Assance 9 years of age.

Ask why?

I have had occasion to visit this Man's home on different occasions and found it to be in a very filthy condition and certainly no place for children of this age, Assance apparently is not a very good manager and we have had to help him out with clothes and shoes so that they could attend school.

His Mother Mrs Lazarus Assance who lives with them is very old and totally incapable of looking after the children consequently they go to school more often than not without anything to eat.

I have had this man get his house cleaned up several times but it soon is as filthy as ever so I think the Department would be doing a very great favor to these children if they were to grant the request of the father to send them to a Residential School.

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th instant, regarding the children of Wilson Assance, who have recently been placed in the Chapleau Indian Residential School.

These boys were placed in a residential school on the recommendation of the Indian Agent, who reported as follows regarding home conditions:-

"I have had occasion to visit this man's home on different occasions and found it to be in a very filthy condition and certainly no place for children of this age. Assance, apparently, is not a very good manager and we have had to help him out with clothes and shoes so that they could attend school.

"His mother, Mrs. Lazarus Assance, who lives with them, is very old and totally incapable of looking after the children, consequently, they go to school more often than not without anything to eat.

"I have had this man get his house cleaned up several times but it soon is as filthy as ever, so I think the Department would be doing a very great favour to these children if they were to grant the request of the father to send them to a residential school."

In view of the above report, the Department considered that it was in the best interests of these boys to have them placed in a residential school and, as the Chapleau School was the only one at which there were vacancies, they were sent there. This school is well-managed and the boys will receive every possible care and a good education. Owing to lack of accommodation at other schools, it will not be possible to arrange for their transfer. As for allowing them home on holidays, the Department considers that, in view of the report regarding home conditions, you will agree that such action would not be in the boys' best interests.

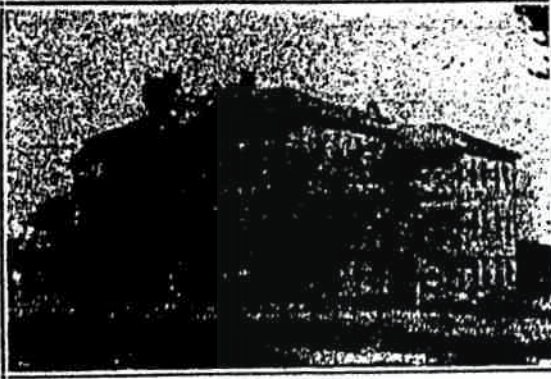

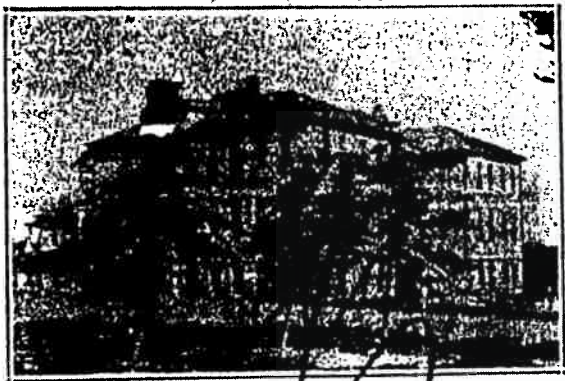

I have to report that Lucy Gaikhezheyongai a member of the Henvey Inlet Band has been at St. John's Indian Residential School Chapleau, for the last eight or nine years, during which time her father died, has now no home to go to. Her uncle Thomas Gaikhezheyongai at Lower French Reserve, stated that he would take her for the summer holidays. Rev. Alfred J. Vale, Superintendent of the Chapleau Indian Residential School, sent her to Plokeral station, Lower French Reserve and paid her fare. I sent the bill to the Department.

Since Lucy Gaikhezheyongai arrived at her uncle's home she has been very discontented and both she and her uncle want her to go back to the school. Lucy is a very backward girl and I would recommend that she be received back into the school, as I am afraid something might happen to the girl. I think Rev. Vale would agree with me that she should be accepted back into the school. I have written to him and he suggests that Lucy be returned to the school. Her fare would have to be paid as her uncle has no money for the fare.

Would the Department please give their consent for the return of Lucy Gaikhezheyongai to the school, with the least possible delay, as I am afraid that something might happen to this girl.

The consideration of the Department will be very much appreciated.

Enclosed please find the Report for our school for the quarter ending September 30th 1935.

I was away for a vacation so am a little late in getting this report in this time. I beg to draw your attention to a few things in connection with it.

First I wish to acknowledge your letter in which you gave reasons why it was difficult to grant the extra for High School in the case of Walter Heil No. 65-I-22 Dtd Oct. 2-1935. I beg to say I am taking up the matter with the Authorities here and trust you will allow him to remain in our school until I can give fuller report on his case His No. is 115 and is listed on this report.

I have inserted two names. George Iserhoff No. 221 and Grace Minnie Iserhoff No. 0199. These have not yet been approved by you. In explanation I beg to state Bishop Anderson was in touch with the father sometime before they were sent to us. They had no means of having them Examined by a Doctor and sent them to us at the father's expense entirely. I have had them examined by the Doctors here and they are found suitable candidates for our school. The application forms are filled out and are now in transit back to the father to be properly attested and returned to me. I will forward same as soon as I get them. I know this is irregular. I could not well avoid it and I hope you will accept them under these circumstances. The father has for a long time tried to get these children into this school. The mother is dead.

NO. 142 Redfern Louttit is over the age limit of 18 years. I am asking for his discharge. I have arranged for him to go to Wycliffe College Toronto to train for the Ministry of the Church.

Rightly or otherwise I was under the impression the Department would carry pupils on after 18 years of age if they were attending High School hence my action in these two cases. I beg pardon for apparent error.

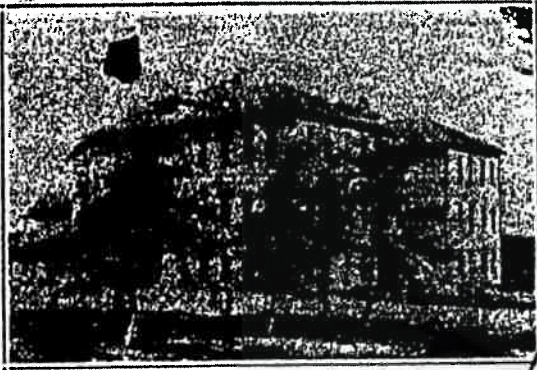

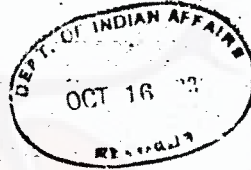

In checking over the Report of this school for the quarter ending September 30th which went forward a few days ago, I found the name of Frances McBeady No.0132 went through without an explanatory note to show why her name is still on the list although granted a discharge. The reason is this. Her father wanted her home in the Summer then wrote and asked for her to be kept here a little longer, until he had things comfortable for her. This we did. He found it necessary to be away from home and will not return until Christmas time so I acceded to his wish on condition he should pay her fare home at that time. He has agreed to this. I have therefore kept her here and am giving her special instruction in the Domestic work preparatory to her going home. I trust this may meet with your approval.

I would like to ask permission to Keep Charlie Moore No160 who is over 16 years of age so that he may fit himself for Farm work as he wishes to carry on when he leaves us.

No.127. Stanley White Aged 15 passed the High School Entrance this spring but did not get the 70 per cent to entitle him to the grant so he has asked to be allowed to stay and learn farm work so he can take a position as a farmer when he gets old enough to do that.

I shall be very grateful if you can give favourable consideration to the above requests. I may add neither of these boys have a home to go to and it does not seem wise to turn them off so young. I will do my best to locate them as soon as I can.

Test results show special ability in mathematics. She is an unusually attractive Indian girl of superior intelligence who has evidently had excellent training. She should be encouraged in her ambition to be a teacher.

Financial Situation:

Mother has been supporting the children for about four years as father does not take responsibility and is not working. She placed both girls in Earls Court Home when they came to Toronto in July 1935. She then obtained position as nursemaid for Muriel. The Board of Education refused a permit for work for her and her mother could not pay more than \$12. a month, which she is paying for Myra. As she is only earning \$30. a month and has to buy her own clothes and help the boy John. When at Sutton Muriel received \$7.50 a month from the Indian Agent to enable her to attend High School. This was later discontinued when she left school to look after her father. Mrs. Shache thinks she could give about \$2.50 a month towards Muriel's board. The relatives are unable to help and if she were sent back to them she could not attend High School.

Religion:

Parents are United Church but Muriel has been confirmed in the Anglican Church.

Canon Gould has forwarded to us a copy of a letter received by him from Mr. Sutherland. We understand you also have a copy of this letter and as there are some details in it which are not actually correct, we are writing to explain.

Muriel has been attending Jarvis Collegiate Institute here since coming to our Shelter. She has picked up this term's work and feels rather confident that she can do the first term exams in December with the exception of perhaps Geometry and Physiography, which she says are taught differently here. She, herself, is ambitious and wants to get on, and although it would appear she has not taken advantage of what the Department provided in Sutton, nevertheless we believe there are extenuating circumstances as Mrs. Snache tells us that she had been working in Toronto, sending money to keep up the home. She became ill, went to the hospital here for an operation and when discharged was with a friend here for a few weeks until she was able to go home. Before her return Mr. Snache was ill and not working. They could not get relief and she, herself, was just recovering from her operation and unable to work. They were in such poverty it was out of the question for Muriel to continue at school. She had no clothes and they had barely enough to eat. They could not pay the rent and could not keep the home. Eventually Mrs. Snache obtained work with a family who have brought her to Toronto with them. She brought both of the girls with her and Mr. Snache went to live with relatives.

Muriel was particularly anxious to go to Chapleau as some friends of hers had gone there and this school has also been most highly spoken of by others. We are hoping that you can arrange to admit her after the Christmas holidays so that she can begin the new term in the High School there.

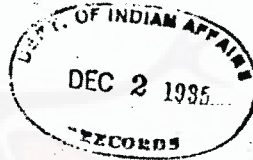

With further reference to your letter of the 18th, inst. No. 65-1-10 re the above, and addressed to Canon Gould, General Secretary of our Society, I am taking the liberty of sending you herewith a copy of a letter from Miss Nora Lea, Supervisor of the Protection Department of the Children's Aid Society of Toronto, as it furnishes some important information about the applicant in question which appears to have been omitted from earlier communications submitted to you.

When our General Secretary forwarded to me all the correspondence relating to this case, and asked me to deal further with the same, I was inclined to recommend to your Department that this Indian girl be admitted to our new Shingwauk School, but in view (1) of the large number of Indian girls recently sent to this school by your Department and (2) in view of the fact, set forth in the closing paragraph of the enclosed letter, that the girl herself was anxious to go to Chapleau as she had friends there, I changed my opinion.

Some time ago I notified the Principal of our Chapleau School of the possibility of this girl being admitted to that institution, and in the light of the information set forth in the enclosed letter, it appears to me that the case is one deserving of your help, and I sincerely trust you may be able to provide it, by authorizing her admission to our Chapleau School from the 1st. of January next so that she may be able to attend High School in Chapleau along with the other two girls for whom I understand you have authorized the usual High School grant.

I trust this will afford the information required.

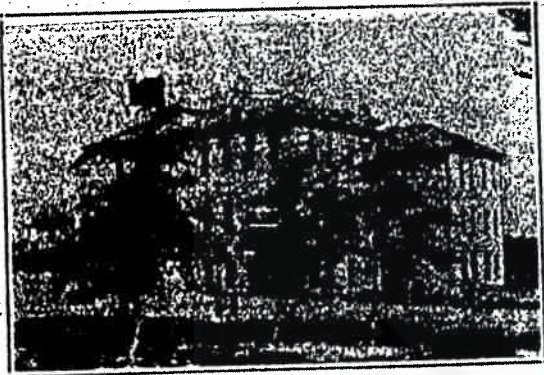

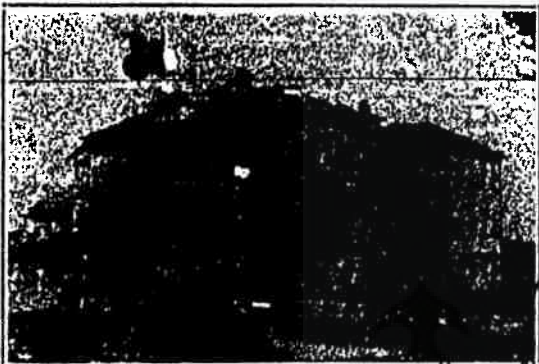

I have tried severe whipping and various methods of punishments such as extra work instead of play, being sent to bed early and loss of extra privileges but all seem to have failed to cure her of exhibitions of temper and passive resistance to the rules of the classroom and school in general. She has now openly defied my orders to go to school even in the face of the knowledge that this would mean her having to leaving the school entirely with a possible going to a reform school. This was held over her to no effect.

I am of the opinion it would be better to arrange for her to be sent back to her own people at Ruperts House where she belongs. With your permission I will arrange for that to be done as soon as I can do so.

I am now writing to Right Reverend Bishop Anderson at Cochrane to see when she could be sent back with some hope of getting to her people. Have I your permission to send her before the end of the term? I think some thing must be done as it is practically a calling into question before the other pupils our power to demand and obtain obedience to proper discipline.

I have not submitted this to Indian Agent Godfrey as she is not one of his Indians and in previous instances of a similar nature he has said it did not come under him.

NO. 0111 Betty Claus aged 19 years has been for a long time at school here not strong enough to go on with her High school work and I have recently secured good easy employment for her at the Town Hospital where she gets medical attention she needs and a small wage and so is able to care for herself. I would request her discharge be allowed her to date from April first.

I know this is irregular, I should ask for the discharge first but I feel sure you will agree it is good to take advantage when I get the chance to place these girls and I cannot wait until I can get permission or miss the opportunity.



I do not think the other boys would pay for sending to the High School but Charlie Moore No.160 and Leslie Williams No.188 have no homes to go to and would be the better for being allowed to remain here longer. They will never make a mark in education but will do well in the out-door work of the school on the farm and their characters would be the better able to withstand the temptations of surroundings on the Reserve if permitted to remain and be built up.

GIRLS.

No.0103. Eileen Rathburn This girl has attended High School now for two terms. She did well at the Examination last Spring. I regret to say she has not done so well this year and I would recommend she be given her discharge and allowed to return to her married Sister's home in Burlington Ontario, who has offered her a home. As she was sent here by the Department, I presume they will pay her fare home.

No.0120. Ruby Laforce. This girl is a big strong girl physically but has little ability as a student. She has asked me to try to get her a position as Domestic this summer if I can. She is not a member of the Band though she came from Bala. I would like permission to keep her on until I can, within a reasonable time get her placed. Her home surroundings would be very unhelpful if sent back to the Reserve this summer.

No.0122. Jane Blacksmith, This girl has the makings of a fine type of woman. I think she ought to be given a chance to remain here longer and see what she can do in the classroom until she can be placed as a Domestic rather than be sent home to her father who has married again and the home is not fit for her to return to, with any chance to make use of her training here.

You ask my opinion of the other Pupils who were sent to the High School. I would say with a few exceptions they did not warrant the extra cost to send them. Some had ability but would not apply themselves. Others did not have the ability to meet the standard and became discouraged. One, Darcy Black, a lame boy, made very good use of his chance. He got his Junior Matriculation and took a course at Business College with Shaw of Toronto in Book Keeping and accounting and passed with Honours. He is I believe now a Time Keeper at one of the Fire Ranger Districts.

Miss Emily Donald passed and took up Normal Training as a Teacher. She taught three years in a day school and is this Fall trying to return to Normal to make her Teacher Certificate Permanent. She is applying to Normal School at North Bay this Fall.

Miss Ella Green, went to High School and then on to Train as a Nurse in Toronto. She has graduated and taken her R.N., and is employed at her Training home Hospital for as long as she desires to remain there.

Lorne Rathburn had ability but proved too lazy to carry on. He is now I believe an Orderly in a Hospital in Ottawa. I do not think it pays to send Pupils to High School unless they show special aptitude for it and I will be honest in not recommending any others if you allow me that privilege.

Circular letter of the 15th instant outlined part of Section 10 (1) of the Indian Act. In future, the Department desires that, when children reach the age of 16 years and you consider they should be retained in the school for a further period, you should write the Department, through the office of your local Indian Agent, giving your reasons for keeping them and asking the Department's permission.

Great care should be exercised in choosing those who are given the advantages of high school education. The qualification of obtaining 70% on the Entrance examination is reasonably high, but, at the same time, I feel you will agree there is a better chance of obtaining children who will take advantage of the opportunity offered to them when we insist upon this standard. If children going to high school are not successful at the end of the year's examinations and are not promoted to a higher form, the Department is not prepared to consider granting them further assistance. You should, of course, write the Department before August 15th, giving the names and full particulars regarding any pupils of the Chapleau Residential School, who, you consider, should attend high school during the academic year 1934-35.

I beg leave to report that there are several children pupils of the Chapleau Indian School who have not returned to the school, and it appears that there is a regular organized effort to flaunt the requests that the children be returned, and I have been told that they were not sending them back, and as these families are getting relief I have advized them that their small allowance of relief would be out off but they still insist that they will not send the children back.

There are three families who are persisting in holding the children at home giving various reasons why the should not be sent back and I would suggest authority be given to send a truant officer or Policeman after them as it is having a very bad effect with the other children at the school.

Then there is another case that of a girl about 15 years of age who was given a return ticket to go and visit her Aunt in Toronto and now she will not return the girl and as I am informed that living with this woman is no fit place for this girl I would also reccomend that a truant Officer be sent to bring her back to the school, and unless firm action is taken in all these cases there will be a great deal of trouble in the future.

DEAR Sir:-

For the first time in my six years here I have had to call upon the Police to act as Truant officer and bring back some children who have overstayed their Summer Vacation and the parents refused to send them back.

I have taken up the matter with the Chief of Police in the town of Chapleau and he has acted within his jurisdiction. The question arises as to what shall be done in the case of children who are not in the Municipality and to be safe he has asked me to write to you and see if you will in accordance with the Indian Act appoint him as Truant Officer so as to enable him to go to the homes of the said children and compel them to return to school.

All the children who have not returned are under the school age of 16 years and therefore ought to be returned. The parents refuse in the case of two children at Missanabic Ontario about 50 miles west of this town on the Railway.

I would take this matter up through the Indian Agent but he is away on leave of absence at the present. He told me he would write for authority to have them brought back. I have waited two weeks and no word had come so, as I expect to be away from the school for a month on vacation, I thought it best to write you direct and ask you, if it meets with your approval, to appoint the Chief of Police here as Truant Officer to enable him to do what he is quite ready to do if granted such authority.

Will you be good enough to write him direct to the following address: P. Dery Chief of Police Chapleau Ontario.



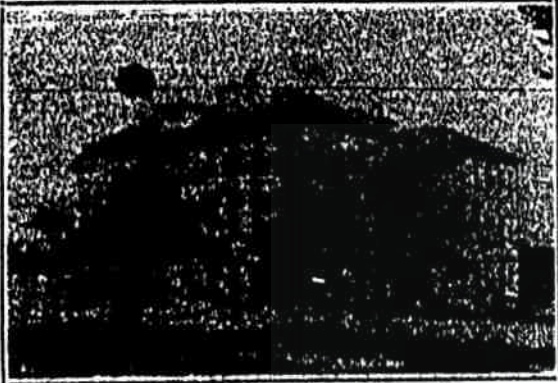

I hereby gratefully acknowledge receipt of your permission to pay the railway fare of Charlie Heil to Bala and will send the duly signed receipt for same.

In the same letter No. 65-I-10 Dated September 7th you ask after quoting a Telegram from James Gideon of Missinabic, if there is any reason the children should not be returned to the school? In reply would say there is absolutely no reason for not doing so. They are some of these I wrote to you in a previous letter in which I made request that you would appoint the Chief Of Police Truant Officer so he could compel these children to be sent back to school. They have ever stayed their leave for holidays and the parents, as shown in the telegram, have refused to send them back. The chief of Police of Chapleau made a trip up there for children. All of these whom he went to get came back quietly except this man's two children a boy and a girl he defied the Chief and said he was out of his territory and that he would not send them but would get in touch with you.

He makes the ridiculous statement that the children were inflicted with Head Lice when they went home. Every one here knows the reverse is the truth, they went home clean and each time they come back after holidays they had to be cleaned up. He says in a letter to me they went home dirty and for that reason he would not let them come back. You can appoint any person you wish to investigate I suggest you write the Indian Agent for a character sketch of this man who has given a lot of trouble in the past to the Agent.

It is my opinion an example should be made of this case and compel the return of these children and avoid more trouble of this sort in the future.

Will you be good enough to give the necessary authority to the Chief and so convince these people they must obey the law.







In reply to your letter of September 18th beg to report that after being in communication with Mr. Agent Daly, re the admission of the illegitimate daughter of Bertha King, not Bernice the facts are as follows, this woman is a member of the Christian Island Band No 234 also member of the United Church here.

This woman while working in Toronto, Ontario got into trouble and refuses to tell the name of the man responsible.

She is very anxious to get out and secure work which it is impossible for her to do as long as she has to care for the child herself.

Under the circumstances, she being a member of the Christian Island Band I would recommend that the child be admitted to the Chapleau Indian Residential School as the mother has no chance of making a living while encumbered with the child and owing to the circumstances I think the Department should assume the responsibility of the education of her daughter.

Sir,-

With further reference to your letter of the 10th ultimo, enclosing an application form and certificate of health for the admission of Bernice Kate King to the Chapleau Indian Residential School, I have to say that the Indian Agent at Christian Island reports that the mother is not able to properly care for this girl and he recommends that she be admitted to the Chapleau School. The Department will, therefore, approve of her admission, provided the school authorities can accommodate her.

It may be that you could arrange to have this girl sent to Chapleau along with Virginia Pawis, whose admission was approved by official letter of the 18th ultimo. It might be advisable to communicate with the Principal and ascertain if he can accept these girls. Accounts covering the cost of their transportation should be forwarded in the usual manner. All expenditures in this connection should be kept as low as possible.
