This child is exceedingly short sighted in the right eye. He cannot read anything at all on the card.

The price of fitting each child with glasses, ^{lenses} consisting of supplying a good substantial frame and ^{lenses} these are first quality lens, would be \$8.00 per pair. This is a very low price for the quality of lens we are supplying but as a child derives a much greater benefit from this type of lens we think you would be well advised to accept it.

We might add that none of these children have more than 80% normal vision.

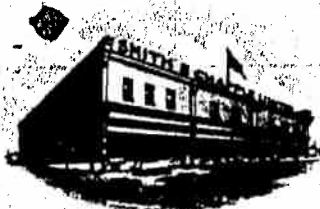

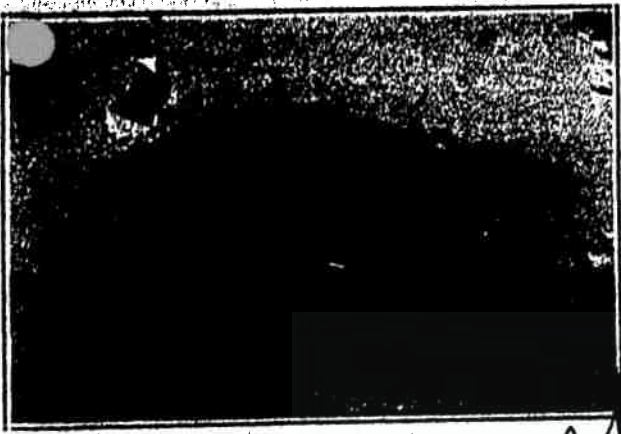

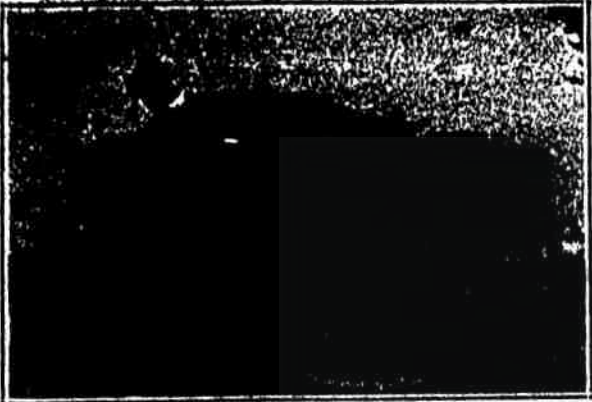

Dear Sir:-

I beg to report the following expenses were incurred in carrying out the order from Mr McGinnes in sending two girls to the Sanitarium on account of the T.B. Clinic Report.

I regret to have to say it was not possible to send the two at the one time as there was no room at time of order from K.M. Showey Esq. M.D. of the Department of Health. Toronto came telling us to send Margaret Matchequis at once to Weston. This was promptly carried out and about a week later room was found for the other girl Minnie Trapper in The Mountain Sanitarium in Hamilton. This called for two trips by Mrs Vale as escort.
